

In terms of developing future leaders, we inducted ten outstanding international alumni into the prestigious International Fellows Hall of Fame this year, three since the last magazine. Ranging from top generals to chiefs of staff, these distinguished officers credit their Army War College education as integral to their professional growth and now hold key global positions advancing military cooperation.

In October, the Chief of Staff of the Army and other senior leaders joined us for Army Leader Day. Our Resident Class of 2024 greatly benefited from direct engagement with General George and the distinguished leaders from Headquarters, Department of the Army who accompanied him. Amongst the important learning activities on Army Leader Day, we also took time to celebrate all those who contributed to the new Root Hall in a fantastic ribbon-cutting ceremony.

U.S. ARMY WAR COLLEGE COMMANDANT'S UPDATE CONTINUED

Also in October, we executed a major wargame for First Army on mobilization in future contested environments. The insights gathered will directly improve planning and resourcing for this vital capability. More recently, our team delivered an Arctic wargame for the U.S. Army Pacific and 11th Airborne Division Commanders, identifying strengths and capability gaps against operational requirements. Across the last fiscal year, we also delivered tailored Theater Army Staff Courses that graduated over 190 specially trained officers to meet distinct theater needs. These activities are representative of a broad portfolio of educational and analytical support provided to Combatant Commands and Theater Armies.

Our Futures Lab saw a record 500 visitors in November, enabling cutting-edge technology instruction for students and faculty in areas like robotics and artificial intelligence. Our Strategic Studies Institute published acclaimed work — like analyses of China's military logistics developments and the Army profession. And our thought leadership on matters of national defense and the strategic use of landpower remain in high demand, with the *Parameters* journal approaching an incredible 500,000 article downloads just this year.

Beyond campus, our geographically-dispersed students tighten bonds between America's military and society. This year we executed over 60 community engagements directly supporting Army communications plans. At Veterans Day events nationwide, students highlighted groundbreaking capabilities with local influencers and future soldiers.

As you can see, through the innovative efforts and intellectual rigor of our entire Army War College team, we continue generating enormous value for our Army and nation. Our recent accomplishments and continued striving in developing agile strategic leaders and producing research that informs key decisions demonstrate our commitment to pushing boundaries. We hope you share our pride in these milestones. MESSAGE FROM THE PROVOST

As we find ourselves at the midpoint of the academic year, the U.S. Army War College (USAWC) is abuzz with activity, gearing up for an eventful spring season. With our state-of-the-art academic building now in full swing, students and faculty are diving into the myriad possibilities it offers for advanced learning.

Major highlights of this season are the pioneering initiatives being undertaken in collaboration with the Office of the Chief of Staff of the Army (CSA). The first initiative involved a two-day course designed for senior leaders, focusing on the critical areas of data literacy and artificial intelligence. The Center for Strategic Leadership conducted a pilot of this course, and has recently delivered it to a wider audience of senior Army leaders. If successful, this program is poised to become a cornerstone in the development of senior leaders across the Army, showcasing the USAWC's commitment to staying at the forefront of cutting-edge military education.

The second CSA initiative is a multi-year research project led by **Dr. Steve Metz**, exploring the strategic dimensions of warfighting culture. The inaugural year is dedicated to answering the question: "How do strategic leaders or organizations optimized for war differ from ones simultaneously focused on peace, competition, conflict, and warfighting?" With over a dozen faculty members, students, and fellows contributing to this ambitious project, the USAWC is actively contributing to the evolution of strategic thought and leadership.

In a move toward fostering a more inclusive and collaborative environment, the Provost's Office has been engaging in open dialogues through a series of brown bag lunches with various stakeholder groups. These sessions have proved invaluable in gathering suggestions for enhancing the work environment and refining the products of the College. Two significant initiatives have emerged from these discussions. Firstly, we committed to enhance the focus on Women, Peace, and Security (WPS) within the faculty and across our programs. WPS acknowledges women's roles in conflict and recognizes that women are critical actors in achieving sustainable peace and security. A dedicated

long-term faculty position for WPS is in the works, and we are finalizing interim measures to serve as a bridging strategy. Secondly, a crossorganizational working group is addressing the optimization of space reservation across the College's numerous facilities, ensuring the right space is available for each event.

The leadership landscape at the U.S. Army Heritage and Education Center (USAHEC) is undergoing a change with Mr. Geoff Mangelsdorf's retirement after five years as director. COL Lauren Miller, USAWCF '21, the USAWC Fellows Director, has graciously stepped in as the interim AHEC Director while a nationwide search is conducted for a long-term replacement.

Looking ahead, the USAWC is poised for an action-packed spring, featuring international travel with the Advanced Regional Studies seminars, high-profile conferences, electives, and the National Security Seminar. The China Landpower Studies Center within the Strategic Studies Institute is gearing up to achieve full operating capacity, solidifying the USAWC's commitment to remaining a hub for impactful strategic thinking.

The achievements, initiatives, and collaborations we've witnessed thus far at the College are testaments to the collective commitment of our students, faculty, staff, and alumni to excellence in military education and leadership development. Every day we see proof that our graduates and research are making a difference in today's ever-changing security environment.

This past fall, three officers were inducted into the USAWC International Fellows (IFs) Hall of Fame. Honored on October 4, 2023 was Maj Gen Elisabeth G. Michelsen of Norway, RES '19, the 81st inductee. Lt Gen Kenneth Pedersen of Denmark, RES '15, was inducted as the 82nd member on October 26, 2023 and Lt Gen Mihail Popov of Bulgaria, RES '06, as the 83rd member on November 7, 2023.

The IF Hall of Fame was established to provide a prestigious and visible means of honoring IF graduates who have attained the highest positions in their nation's armed forces. Each honoree commented on



The Five Levels of Leadership by COL (Ret) William W. Badger, Ph.D., RES'78.

Written primarily for university students and those just entering the construction industry,


Badger's Five Levels of Leadership were created, studied, and implemented to help better understand leadership skills and provide wisdom for self-improvement. The leadership lessons presented in this book support the theory that improved leadership improves performance.



On Warriors' Wings: Army Vietnam War Helicopters and the **Native Americans they** were Named to Honor by COL (Ret) David A. Napoliello, DCS'84. Twelve Army helicopter

types saw combat in

Vietnam, with eleven bearing Native American names. This book traces the evolution of the Army's policy on the naming of those eleven. For each, the author includes an examination of what capabilities were needed with performance and production requirements, as well as how the aircraft was used during its entire period of service in-country as opposed to a twelve-month snapshot of the experiences of a single aviator or a specific aviation unit. The capstone of each chapter is the story of the Native American tribe or warrior chief and how that history commended it for that particular helicopter. A chapter is also devoted to the experiences of Native Americans who served as pilots or crew members of those eleven aircraft in Vietnam. Over 200 Native Americans perished there, nineteen while participating in aerial operations, and their final missions are addressed. The book concludes with a summary of the Native American-named helicopters that came after Vietnam and includes extensive illustrations and archival images of Native American veterans.



Foresight: Leadership Lessons for the 21st Century by COL (Ret) Alan G. Vitters, RES '87. In this time of rapid social and technological change, foresight is a critical leadership characteristic.

Vision helps leaders plan for the future, but foresight enables them to deal with inevitable changes. Foresight can be developed through critical thinking, questioning biases and assumptions, looking from the outside in, and proactive, intentional anticipation. The author shares lessons and insights, some classical and some cutting edge, on this critical yet undervalued trait of effective leadership. He highlights concepts, theories, cases, and examples derived from the social and behavioral sciences and applies them to leadership qualities required in modern times. It is designed for current and aspiring leaders from all walks of life-- business, the military, first responders, and other service-oriented volunteers and workers. It is written for frontline supervisors, middle managers, executives, and students of leadership and management.





uniforms, equipment, and battle standards of the Russian musketeers of the mid-16th to early-18th century.




My Brother's Keeper by Dr. (COL, Ret) John R. Dabrowski, DDE '02 & former FAC.

This novel is written with the backdrop of historical wartime events occurring in the Summer of 1943, namely the


Holocaust, the invasion of Sicily/Italy, the overthrow and rescue of Mussolini, and the German occupation of Rome, covering the critical months of June-September

of that year. The book follows two main characters, Monsignor Sepp Bertram of the Vatican Foreign Office and his brother, SS Gruppenfuhrer Peter Bertram, who is implementing Hitler's Final Solution in Estonia. Enter Pope Pius XII who sends Sepp to persuade his brother not to kill innocent Jews, but instead, to assist them in reaching the safety of neutral Sweden. What follows is a story of intrigue, heroism, and redemption. The book features a sweeping cast of memorable characters, many drawn from the pages of history.



Letters from Baghdad Volume 1: Tea with Terrorists by COL (Ret) Michael P. Courts, RES '03 chronicles the author's first year in Baghdad from 2006-07. Serving on the Multi-National Forces-Iraq (MNF-I), primarily

in the role of Chief Engagements Branch in the Strategic Effects Directorate, he had a unique perspective on the U.S. led Coalition's efforts to reach out to Sunni insurgent groups and separate them from Al-Qaeda. He describes his team's work as well as what life working in "The Palace" was like. Told in real time, he describes the situation and life in Iraq as it occurred. Like life itself, this book combines the serious issues of the war, insights into daily life of a staff officer, and humor into a compelling narrative of this critical period during the U.S. involvement in Iraq. The perspective of a senior staff officer and the inclusion of lessons learned from each week, as well as topical articles, creates a holistic view of this time in the war.




55 Rules for a Good Life by BG (Ret) Douglas R. Satterfield, DDE '04. The author wrote this

book for those who are interested in bettering themselves, getting fulfillment from life, or making a difference.


He believes that everyone can succeed in life, regardless of one's intelligence, appearance, or popularity. He will not tell you how to live, but provides advice about what you can do to live properly.

The Holy Trinity of Leadership: Getting Results & Winning by MG (Ret) Jimmie Jay Wells, DDE '05. The author, a former NFL player, calls upon personal vignettes from his NFL, U.S. Army, and business

experiences. He coined the phrase "Holy Trinity of Leadership" to explain the ultimate trio of leader characteristics. He exhorts leaders to focus on their sole purpose -results. This unique method to lead simplifies an often overly complicated endeavor. Held in a delicate balance of leadership attributes, this trio of terms can help you underwrite success in any endeavor -- to win.



Self-Care: The Need and A Model by CH (COL, Dr.) B. Gregory Edison, DDE '15. This work explores some specific Christian views of selfcare and presents a specific pastoral model that is

rooted in Christian theology. The theological research for this consists of a study of the Old and New Testaments looking at the foundation and interpretation of self-care. It examines biblical examples of Jesus Christ modeling selfcare, one who always brought balance to His ministry. For clergy and caregivers to maintain spiritual wholeness and resist becoming fragmented, innovation in self-care is needed. A model of self-care will help maintain effective job performance and holistic wellness, particularly in a post-pandemic setting.




Evaluating Public Perceptions

The Legitimacy of Drone Warfare: Evaluating Public Perceptions by LTC Paul Lushenko, FAC, and Shyam Raman. This book examines public perceptions of the legitimacy of drones, and how this affects countries'


policies on and the global governance of drone warfare. Scholars recognize that legitimacy is central to countries' use of drones, and political officials often characterize strikes as legitimate to sustain their use abroad. This book introduces and tests an original middle-range theory that allows scholars, policy-makers, and practitioners to understand how evolving patterns of drone warfare globally shape the public's perceptions of legitimacy that

can moderate countries' drone policies and the global governance of drones. Rather than relate drone warfare to a platform or counterterrorism strikes only, as experts often do, this book argues that drone warfare is best understood as a function of the unique ways that countries use and constrain strikes. By updating theories of drone warfare, this book provides a way to understand public perceptions of legitimacy in cross-national contexts, especially among democratic political regimes that are prefigured on political officials' accountability for the use of force abroad.



Real Soldiering: The US Army in the Aftermath of War, 1815-1980 by Brian McAllister Linn, former FAC. What happens to the U.S. Army after the battles are over, the citizen soldiers depart, and all that remains is the

Regular Army? In this pathbreaking work, Linn argues that in each decade following every major conflict since the War of 1812, the postwar army has undergone a long, painful, and remarkably consistent recovery process as it struggled to build a new model force to replace the "Old Army" that entered the conflict. Linn challenges three common historical interpretations: confusing Washington policy with implementation in the field; conflating postwar armies with prewar armies; and describing certain postwar eras as distinct and transformational. Rather, he examines the postwar force as a distinct entity worthy of study as a unique and important part of U.S. Army history. The work represents over four decades of research into the U.S. Army and is deeply informed by Linn's experiences teaching and working with soldiers.



The All-Volunteer Force: Fifty Years of Service.

Edited by William A. Taylor, with chapters by USAWC personnel as follows: Dr. Beth Bailey, NSS '11; Dr. Jennifer Mittelstadt, former FAC; MG (Ret) Dennis J. Laich,

DCS '97; MG (Ret) Jeffrey E. Phillips, DDE '02; and Dr. Marybeth Ulrich, former **FAC.** In crafting this far-reaching collection of 15 essays by a multidisciplinary group of distinguished authors, Taylor examines the allvolunteer force (AVF) in four distinct parts, analyzing its history, results, challenges, and

implications, exploring all the major facets of the AVF—past, present, and future. The influence of the AVF, created in conjunction with the end of the draft in 1973, has reached far beyond the U.S. Armed Forces, affecting the very character of American civil-military relations. While its successes and challenges continue to be widely discussed and fervently debated, the AVF is critical to both U.S. national security and the fabric of American society. The insightful, cogent, and provocative essays contained in this timely volume represent a crucial first step in assessing the AVF after fifty years of service.

STRATEGIC STUDIES INSTITUTE (SSI) & THE USAWC PRESS

The Strategic Studies Institute (SSI) and the USAWC Press have experienced an extraordinarily dynamic and productive fall and winter. SSI has evolved into a leading applied research institute tackling critical national security issues for the U.S. Army, the Department of Defense, and our interagency partners. The Press achieved a publication milestone: 1,357,822 publication downloads from its Digital Commons website since its launch in June 2020.



SSI has successfully established the China Landpower Studies Center (CLSC). The Center's mission is to conduct research and analysis and publish findings on China's global security strategy and capabilities with the aim of enhancing DoD leaders' understanding of the PLA and to inform the development of U.S. Army and Joint strategies and campaigns. In addition, the CLSC will support curriculum development and teaching related to PRC security, military, and Indo-Pacific regional studies.

We have assembled a world class team of military, academic, and intelligence experts to staff the CLSC. COL Richard "Rich" Butler, RES '16, an Army Strategist, is the inaugural Director to leverage his extensive operational experience in the Indo-Pacific to ensure that the research team supports our key DoD stakeholders' research and analysis needs, and war gaming, training, and exercise support activities. Mr. Josh Arostegui is our first Academic Chair of China Studies, responsible for directing and managing the research efforts of the CLSC. He is assisted by two research faculty professors, two strategic intelligence analysts, and two visiting academics on loan to the CLSC through the federal government's Intergovernmental Personnel Act Mobility Program.

He holds an M.A. and Ph.D. from the School of Advanced International Studies, Johns Hopkins University. Fluent in Mandarin and Russian, Brian's reseach interests involve PRC-Russia military cooperation, and what the PRC is learning from Russia's war with Ukraine. Our third CLSC faculty member is Mr. Rick Gunnell, Research Professor of China Military Studies. Mr. Gunnell came from TextOre, an open-source intelligence company supporting a number of national security clients in the Washington D.C. region. Rick is a Chinese language-enabled subject matter expert on the PLA, its organizational structure, its key elites, military capabilities, and the PLA evolution under President Xi Jinping and the Central Communist Party.

The two highly distinguished visiting scholars are **Dr. Sheena Greitens**, Associate Professor, Lyndon B. Johnson School of Public, and the Director, Asia Policy Program, University of Texas at Austin,

and **Dr. Šumit Ganguly**, the Rabindranath Tagore Chair in Indian Cultures and Civilizations and Professor of Political Science, Indiana University, Bloomington. Dr. Ganguly is a world leading scholar on South Asian regional security and U.S.-India-China relations.

SSI hosted the very first summit of DoD Professional Military Education (PME) China Centers on December 14-15, 2023. Seventeen participants attended the summit from the National Defense University Center for the Study of Chinese Military, the Naval War College China Maritime Studies Institute, Air University China Aerospace Studies Institute, Marine Corps University, and our own CLSC. The intent of the summit was to establish a regular and deliberative means

With respect to the European theatre and its attendant security issues, Russia's invasion of Ukraine remained a key research priority. SSI's Ukraine study team has been conducting analysis of the war to identify strategic implications for the U.S. Army. **Dr. Antulio Echevarria, DDE '02**, has been focusing on the concept and application of Integrated Deterrence in the context of Ukraine. **Dr. John Deni's** research centers on the role and capacities of allies, partners, and NATO in the conflict. **Dr. Bob Hamilton, USAWCF'09** is examining the roles played by strategy, planning, command and control, morale, and leadership, as well as ethical and legal norms. **Dr. Michael**

Lynch is investigating to what extent U.S. security cooperation programs have enabled Ukraine's defense, and he and DMSPO Chair COL Tom Spahr, RES '19 deployed to HQs, Security Assistance Group-Ukraine (SAG-U) in Wiesbaden, Germany November 28 - December 15, 2023. Dr. Ron Grantz is researching the space domain and the role of commercial satellites in this conflict.






Our ongoing collaboration with NATO and its Centre of Excellence-Defense Against Terrorism (COE-DAT) expanded into new research arenas. **COL Eric Hartunian** and **LTC Paul Milas** led a research project delving into the intricate relationship between technology and terrorism. They conducted two workshops bringing together

specialists with expertise in nano weaponry, cybersecurity, artificial intelligence, augmented reality, agro-terrorism, and biosecurity. Our Latin America research professor, **Dr. Evan Ellis**, helped shape and contributed to COE-DAT's October conference on Lessons Learned from Colombia, while **LTC Milas** participated in the Center's research project on Border Security in Contested Environments.

SSI published the 2023 Annual Estimate of the Strategic Security Environment to guide military and national security practitioners, as well as researchers and academics, on the current global security challenges facing the U.S. Army. Another timely and relevant publication is Trusting AI: Integrating Artificial Intelligence into the Army's Professional Expert Knowledge, derived from an integrated research project led by SSI's Research Professor for the Military Profession and Ethic, Dr. Charles "Tony" Pfaff, with research assistance from AY '22 students, Christopher J. Lowrance, Bre M. Washburn, and Brett A. Care.





We bid farewell to **Dr. Conrad C. Crane, DCS '95**, who retired in December 2023. Few people at the U.S. Army War College have had a greater impact on the Army than Con Crane. He leaves a legacy of influencing national defense policy and guiding a generation of military historians. Con joined SSI as a research professor following

ADVANCED STRATEGIC ART PROGRAM (ASAP)

In October, the Advanced Strategic Art Program (ASAP) began its 25th year at the U.S. Army War College with its annual trip to Vicksburg, Mississippi. **Dr. Doug Douds, RES '10, Dr. Darrell Driver, USAWCF '15, and COL Tom Spahr, RES '19,** led the AY24 ASAP students on a four-day staff ride of Ulysses S. Grant's Campaign to seize the critical city of Vicksburg and open the Mississippi River to the Gulf of Mexico. The focus of the experiential learning experience was strategic leadership, joint campaigning, and effective civil-military relations. The trip also included an engagement with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers' Vicksburg District.

ASAP is designed to educate and develop competitively selected national security professionals in the technical, conceptual, and interpersonal skills required to be an effective advisor at the most senior levels of strategy and policy development. Over the 25 years of ASAP's existence, the program has educated 342 national security professionals from all of the Services and many of our interagency partners. Seventy percent of ASAP graduates are still serving, and thirteen percent of ASAP graduates have gone on to flag officer rank.

CENTER FOR STRATEGIC LEADERSHIP (CSL) UPDATE

Environmental Security Program

Dr. Michele Devlin, USAWC Professor of Environmental Security, continues to expand her reach on environmental and national security issues. In November 2023, she was a presenter at the Student Conference on U.S. Affairs (SCUSA), the nation's largest conference of its kind that brings together several hundred young professionals, both civilian college students and military cadets, to work together to develop innovative policies to address global security threats. Dr. Devlin was honored to partner with Dr. Adam Kalkstein (USMA) as a co-host for the team exploring strategies to address climate security concerns, and they are planning to continue to collaborate on future environmental security and regional studies efforts.

Another large outreach engagement included Dr. Devlin's presentation to the student body of Carlisle High School on January 10, 2024. They were studying environmental issues, and their faculty asked her to talk about the Arctic and Antarctic, and how the regions are changing from a physical and human terrain standpoint.

An addition to Dr. Devlin's program this year is a one-year Environmental Security Research Fellow, Mr. Brian Gellert. He is assisting Dr. Devlin and the USAWC faculty who are studying the role that the environment, from an evolving physical and human terrain perspective, has in shaping national and global security issues. His initial projects include helping others better understand the impact of climate on human populations from a social science standpoint, and assisting in wargame development for students that will focus on environmental security in Antarctica as it warms. Brian is assisting several faculty members with a pilot project to help U.S. Army troops in the Eastern U.S. understand how ecosystems are changing in their physical terrain and impacting training considerations. He is also a member of the research team working on the impact of human migration from the Marshall Islands due to environmental degradation and poor economic conditions.

Staying Afloat

As most of you have probably seen the video of the January 21, 2024 emergency on Roi Namur, an island in the northern part of the Marshall Islands' Kwajalein Atoll, you know that the Army base was slammed by rogue waves. Rogue waves are some of the environmental disasters that are more violently impacting Kwajalein due to climate change, in addition to sea-level rise, subsidence, saltwater intrusion, etc. Kwajalein and the Marshalls are considered the tip of the spear for climate change, with important environmental security implications for the U.S. and the globe.









COL Drew Morgan, RES '22 (Class President), took command last summer of U.S. Army Garrison -- Kwajalein Atoll (USAG-KA) so he has been heavily involved in rescuing and housing displaced base workers and residents. Dr. Devlin and her USAWC Environmental Security

Program staffhad already been coordinating closely with COL Morgan and his staff on a study about how climate change is increasingly causing displacement and migration of local Marshallese, thus causing USAG-KA worker shortages now and into the future. Several months ago, the Assistant Secretary of the Army for Installations, Energy, and Environment (ASA-IE&E) asked USAWC to tackle this project (referred to as "Staying Afloat") to better understand climate impacts on the base and surrounding islands.



Four RES '24 students with extensive work experience in INDOPACOM, IMCOM, and USACE are participating in the group Strategy Research Project on these issues: COL Damon Delarosa, COL John Harrell, LTC Virginia Knorr, and Mr. Hugh Hardin. Also involved are COL Yoon Choi (Pentagon reservist in environmental engineering connected to the ASA-IE&E), two federal contractors (Dr. John Munro, ethnographic specialist, and Mr. Steve Cunliffe, environmental security wargaming designer), and Research Fellow Mr. Brian Gellert.

CHAIR UPDATES

Chair of Executive and Strategic Leadership

The 2023-2024 academic year has brought new opportunities and engagements for **Dr. Celestino 'Tino' Perez, RES '15**. The Foundation is proud to provide *margin of excellence* support to the two USAWC programs with which he is engaged.

As the USAWC Chair of Executive and Strategic Leadership, Tino's previous outreach efforts have led to several new roles, including joining the editorial board of the Joint Special University Press and joining several scholarly and practitioner luminaries as a non-resident fellow of the Global and National Security Institute at the University

of South Florida. He was able to travel to Mexico City in late October to give three talks over two days to the class, faculty, and leadership of the Escuela Superior de Guerra about military design, strategy, and strategic thinking and to the faculty about problem-based learning tailored to teaching operational art and strategy. This

collaboration with a North American partner is important. He also had the opportunity to give three hours of instruction and discussion with students from Australia's Command and Staff Course. These presentations, held virtually in November, focused on critical thinking and causal logic and complexity. He plans to travel to Canberra in March to give a week's worth of instruction and participate in an exercise with Australia's more senior cohort at the Australian Defence and Strategic Studies Course.

As Director of the Carlisle Scholars Program, Tino's work from the 2023 Leader Immersion Labs continues to have productive effects. The work completed by students COL Joseph Scott and LTC Tony Perez for Air Space and Missile Defense Command helped win approval from the Secretary of the Army for the creation of an Army Space Branch. COL Kent Park's work on the Selective Service Administration led to an invitation to present his findings at a highprofile Selective Service System workshop in December 2023. Finally, the work of COL Joel Gleason and LTC Giovanni Corrado, IF-Italy on NATO interoperability led to an article published in the November 10th edition of NATO Review. The article, entitled "Turning Standard Ammunition into Shareable Ammunition" and co-written by LTG Lance Landrum, specifically mentions the contributions of the Carlisle Scholars. This year's Carlisle Scholars will be continuing their client-based projects working on questions central to the Army Chief of Staff, the Air Force Chief of Staff, and the 18th Airborne Corps, among others. The third annual Strategy Competition will occur in April, challenging senior-level war colleges and U.S. policy schools in a strategy-formulation competition.

Chair of War Studies

Dr. Mike Neiberg, Chair of War Studies, continues to teach, publish, and represent USAWC extensively in a wide variety of virtual and inperson settings both at home and abroad.

In early September 2023, Dr. Neiberg hosted Mr. Shashank Joshi, the Senior Defence Editor of *The Economist*. Approximately 30 faculty members took advantage of the opportunity to discuss current events and insights with him in preparation for the national security courses with current students. Mr. Joshi also appeared on a WAR ROOM podcast with Dr. Neiberg.

In October, Dr. Neiberg and Dr. Daniel Krebs, FAC went to Athens and Stockholm to prepare for the Advanced Regional Studies trip to Europe in April 2024. The trip involved discussions with professional military education faculty and strategists in countries, including MG Jonny Lindfors, IF-Sweden, RES '18, the current Swedish Chief of Army. While in Greece,

they developed curriculum materials to support the College's teaching of Thucydides as part of the Theory of War and Strategy course.

In December, Dr. Neiberg traveled to the Royal Military Academy at Sandhurst in the United Kingdom to speak at a major international conference dedicated to interpreting the events of 2023 and making some strategic forecasts for 2024. Discussions about artificial intelligence, climate, migration, deterrence, and the current crises in Ukraine and the Middle East all featured prominently.

Other highlights from Dr. Neiberg's U.K. visits involved talks with and strategists scholars from across the British and European scholarly community and leaders of the National Army Museum in London. Changes and challenges exist for all communities supporting military missions education of the public about past, on-going, and future conflicts. Sharing between common communities of practice in areas of of historical digitization collections, outreach varied stakeholders, and

cooperation with peer institutions was very productive, especially with the 250th anniversary of the American Revolution and the 80th anniversary of D-Day approaching.

U.S ARMY HERITAGE AND EDUCATION CENTER (USAHEC)

On September 29, 1966, COL George S. Pappas, RES'66 introduced to then MG William J. McCaffrey, RES'53, the Commandant at the time, the idea of establishing a Military History Research Collection at Carlisle Barracks. On June 12, 1967, GEN Harold K. Johnson, Chief of Staff of the U.S. Army, officially established it, and over the 56 years since, the collection has grown significantly, primarily through the generosity of both current and former Soldiers and their families.

The foundation of the collection began with the "Washingtonburg Ledger," a post-Revolutionary War quartermaster ledger documenting the items available at Carlisle Barracks, ranging from bullets and cannons to shoes, offering a snapshot of the U.S. Army's inventory at that time. The addition of a large portion of the original 1840 War Department Library also contributed significantly. The inclusion of GEN Harold K. Johnson's papers and materials from the successful veteran surveys marked a transformative phase, leading to the establishment of the U.S. Army Heritage and Education Center (USAHEC) as we know it today.

The pivotal moment that ignited the collection's growth involved the development and distribution of surveys to all known veterans of the Spanish-American War and the Philippine Insurrection. This initiative was conceived by a curator of the Military History Research Collection, with the intention of seeking answers to questions he wished he could have asked Civil War veterans. The responses themselves to these

surveys not only provided valuable insights, but also resulted in veterans sending letters, diaries, journals, reports, uniforms, and equipment to the facility. The success of these surveys prompted the creation of similar surveys for other historical periods.

As the USAHEC collection expanded, the staff grew to include professionals specializing not only in the library field, but also in archives and museum work. Currently, the collection is particularly robust covering the period from the Spanish-American War to World War II. There remains substantial room for growth in periods such as the Cold War, Vietnam, Desert Storm, and The Global War on Terror. The collection's focus has also shifted recently from general historic preservation to a more nuanced exploration of how senior leaders make decisions and the experiences of those tasked with implementing those decisions. To achieve this, the center has relied heavily on the papers of influential figures like GEN Omar N. Bradley, REŠ '34, and GEN Donn A. Starry, RES '66. This collection has recently been further enriched by the generous contribution of several boxes of papers from the family of LTG Richard G. Trefry, RES '69. To continue to build the collection for the future, we are asking readers to consider their own materials for inclusion in the Center's collection.

As of mid-December 2023, all graduation plaques and stained-glass windows have been successfully removed and are in storage until integrated into our proposed Alumni Hall and Park.







GEN Gordon R. Sullivan, RES '78



Army War College community mourns the loss of one of its distinguished graduates-GEN Gordon R. Sullivan, RES '78, the 32nd Chief of Staff of the U.S. Army (CSA). He died on January 2, 2024.

GEN Sullivan and I shared a love of Army history that resulted in a close working relationship that extended long beyond our retirements from the Army in 1995. His career in the years immediately after his

graduation from USAWC allowed him to hone his skills at many challenging jobs, but his first Pentagon assignment came in 1989—as the Deputy Chief of Staff for Operations (DCSOPS). The Army's world was changing rapidly because the Mutual Balanced Force Reduction Treaty appeared to be on its way to completion. He used his knowledge of our history to help him guide the changes within the Army— "No more Task Force Smiths" was an early rallying cry which became more relevant as he rose through VCSA to CSA in 1991. He needed to carry the Army into the Information Age while leading major downsizing and re-alignment after the victory in Desert Storm. "Maintain Continuity while accommodating Change" became another tenet of his key strategies.

USAWC had been conducting many Senior Leader Staff Rides by the time GEN Sullivan came to Washington, so he built on that effort, even taking newly-promoted four-star generals (and a new Secretary of the Army) on personal staff rides as a means of helping them understand where he was trying to take the Army. each one, he also developed insights and emerging clarity about the many responsibilities he had. GEN Grant may have been his favorite general from the War of the Rebellion, but he drew even greater inspiration from the statue of a Union Soldier at the center of the National Cemetery at Sharpsburg with the inscription, "Not for themselves, but for their country." That was what he expected of himself and everyone else in his Army.

The USAWC organizations and facilities were central to GEN Sullivan's leadership initiatives. One of his first Senior Leader Staff Rides proceeded directly from the Wilderness battlefield to Carlisle Barracks so that leaders could socialize at the old Officers' Club before getting down to serious business in the new Collins Hall, the Center for Strategic Leadership – the center he was privileged to help dedicate while CSA.

As a result of the various peacekeeping/stability operations that occurred as our Army adjusted to the world after the Cold War, GEN Sullivan established the Peacekeeping Institute (PKI) at Carlisle Barracks in 1993, which grew further into the Peacekeeping and Stability Operations Institute (PKSOI) and continued to support it after he retired.



It was for those and many other efforts that he was selected by the Foundation as an Army War College Outstanding Alum in 2010. Those of us who had a chance to work for him were truly fortunate.

MG (Ret) Robert H. 'Bob' Scales, Jr.



MG (Ret) Robert H. 'Bob' Scales, Jr. passed away on January 12, 2024.

MG Scales came to the Army War College in the summer of 1997 as the 44th Commandant with a reputation as a soldier-scholar. Over the ensuing three years, he proved to be an ideal choice to lead the Army's senior academic institution.

In addition to varied command and staff assignments, to include service in Vietnam where he earned a Silver Star while in command of a firing battery during the fighting on Hamburger Hill, MG Scales earned a Ph.D. in History from Duke University. His interest in Professional Military Education (PME) was grounded in his experience leading soldiers and in their professional education, especially after his leadership role at the Field Artillery School. He authored *Certain Victory*, the U.S. Army's official account of the Persian Gulf War, and prior to becoming the USAWC Commandant, he served in the Army's Training and Doctrine Command working on the new operational concepts, force designs, and military capabilities that would be launched as the "Army After Next" program.

MG Scales arrived at Carlisle Barracks as a man in a hurry with a clear idea of what he wanted to accomplish as Commandant. First among his goals and accomplishments was to continue the curriculum development that had been in progress since the end of the Cold War in the early 1990s. This involved transitioning the curriculum away from the "big war" scenarios into one that would prepare and equip

graduates to deal with the broad range of military challenges ranging from small wars, to peacekeeping and peacemaking operations, while sustaining the vital skills demanded by large scale conflicts.

The composition of the faculty was also one of MG Scales' most enduring accomplishments. Senior officers had to be prepared to serve in a variety of roles that involved working closely with their civilian counterparts at the highest levels of government on the synchronization of military plans and operations to achieve political ends. He perceived from his education and experience that the skills necessary to succeed in this environment would benefit from "putting more history in the curriculum," strengthening it particularly in the areas of strategy and policy. To this end, he managed personally the recruiting of both his military and civilian faculty. He sought to find officers who he described as "practical as well as intellectual soldiers," those with backgrounds in the military arts of the profession <u>and</u> in educational assignments, those with a tour on the faculty of an Army educational institution.

MG Scales gave attention to how best to use the Harold K. Johnson Professor of Military History to assist his efforts. The Johnson Professor had been an invitational one-year position offered to academics that brought them to Carlisle where the incumbents normally spent the year doing research at the Military History Institute, with minimal involvement with the War College academic programs. MG Scales changed the focus of that position and his first selection for the Johnson Professorship was Dr. Williamson 'Wick' Murray, a noted scholar with an abiding interest in PME. With Professor Murray's support, MG Scales instituted a voluntary "book group" program, where interested students would sign up to read a military history selection and then attend an after-hours session, where the author would lead a discussion on the book. The program proved highly successful and endures to this day as the Commandant's Reading Program.

development was the "Professor, USAWC Program." Finding it difficult to recruit officers with the right academic credentials to support the College's new degree-granting curriculum, he designed a program whereby officers with potential would be selected and sent to first-tier universities to obtain a Ph.D. in History or Political Science (soon expanded). He sought and received support for this program from the senior Army leadership and sent the first cohort of officers to attend this program in 2000. Over the years, the products of this program have added highly-qualified military faculty members across the resident and non-resident academic departments.

Along with his efforts to enhance the capabilities and credentials of the faculty, and after a thorough examination of the curriculum, MG Scales built on a similar program being taught at Ft. Leavenworth where the School of Advanced Military Studies (SAMS) had proven successful at developing a cadre of operational artists. In the fall of 1999, he directed the creation of a pilot program that came to be called the Advanced Strategic Art Program (ASAP). His intention with this program was to create a group of officers steeped in strategy and history who would possess a deep understanding for and appreciation of the uses of the military instrument of war in pursuit of political ends. The program would serve as a testing ground for potential changes to the curriculum at large and it proved to be an unqualified success, continuing to this day fulfilling the missions he intended for it.

MG Scales' most impressive and long-lasting contribution to faculty Among many tasks, the USAWC Commandant is responsible for outreach -- telling the Army's story to the larger political, civilian, and academic communities. To that end, MG Scales seized hold of another program and expanded its emphasis with outside audiences, the Strategic Leader Staff Ride. MG Scales combined orientation and education to expose those with little knowledge or experience with the Army with a day-long outing to one of several local Civil War Battlefields, Gettysburg or Antietam. In his introduction to the battlefield, he would impress upon the group that while the battles had occurred in the past, the insights offered by the experience on the human dimension of war were enduring. The day on the battlefield was followed by a second day of sessions at the College led by members of the faculty devoted to seminars on strategy, change in large organizations, and strategic decision-making. MG Scales not only directed this program but often would personally lead the battlefield walks as well as the subsequent seminars. This program also endures to this day.

After military retirement in the summer of 2000 and for the next 23 years, MG Scales continued to provide service of inestimable value to the College, sharing his experience and insights to help with strategic decisions about curriculum, resourcing, and vision. He also supported the establishment and growth of the U.S. Army Heritage and Education Center in various roles and served as Chairman of the Board of the Army Heritage Center Foundation until recently. For many years, he also continued to lecture and write on military affairs, frequently appearing on news programs with comments on newsmaking military operations.

COL (Ret) Roger H. C. Donlon, DCS '84

COL (Ret) Roger H. C. Donlon, DCS '84, Medal of Honor recipient, and U.S. Army War College Outstanding Alum, died on January 25, 2024. In December 1964 when presented the Medal of Honor by President Lyndon B. Johnson for his heroism in Vietnam, he became both the first person to receive the Medal of Honor for actions in Vietnam, as well as the first member of the U.S. Army Special Forces ever to be so honored. His stellar service continued beyond Vietnam with duty in a variety of Infantry and Special Forces assignments before his military retirement in 1988. In retirement, his selfless commitment to community and country continued as he served on multiple boards and committees that supported youth and veteran causes. In 1997, he was recognized for his efforts with his selection in the inaugural U.S. Army War College Outstanding Alum cohort, along with GEN (Ret) Walter T. 'Dutch' Kerwin, Jr., RES' '57, who passed away in 2008.
