We received the Army's final approval a few months ago to proceed with the construction phases for this project and we are moving out smartly to do that. We are proud that the Foundation will enable the College to bring the bronze graduation plaques and the one-of-a-kind stained-glass windows out of storage and into beautiful new settings. The Alumni Hall and Park will be built directly across from the new Root Hall and you can see more about that location and more renderings in our introductory video at usawc.org.

I cannot say enough about the commitment of our Board of Trustees to support the Alumni Hall and Park. At every turn, our Trustees have stepped up with major commitments, to include the first substantial pledge of funds to launch our campaign.





A very impressive milestone was reached on December 24, 2024 by our most senior USAWC graduate, COL (Ret) Herb Stern, RES '55. I was privileged to attend his 106th birthday party and I remain in awe of how capable he is at that very impressive age. As we have covered previously, Herb is the "oldest grad" for both the U.S. Military Academy and the U.S. Army War College, a highly unusual combination because of the 20-year difference that normally separates those two graduations. Herb explains this by sharing that he received orders for the War College with only 12 years service and when he questioned them, he was told to go where his orders told him to go so he did. *Congratulations on 106, Herb!* 

On January 3, 2025, **GEN (Ret) Richard Cavazos, RES '69**, was awarded the Medal of Honor posthumously for his actions in Vietnam on October 30, 1967. This was an upgrade of the second Distinguished Service Cross he had been awarded for his actions in the face of grave danger that day, the first having been awarded for his actions in battle during the Korean War on September 10, 1953. He died on October 29, 2017 and is buried in the Fort Sam Houston National Cemetery.

# U.S. ARMY WAR COLLEGE COMMANDANT'S UPDATE

In August 1966 at the dedication of the Chair of Strategic Appraisal named in his honor, former **President Dwight David Eisenhower (USAWC Class of 1928)** remarked, "The War College marks a very great change in the thinking or, let us say, the formal education of officers of our armed services." He went on to posit, "realizing that war involves every single facet of human existence and thinking, every asset that humans have developed, all of the resources of nature, here education deserts the formerly rather narrow business of winning a tactical victory on a battlefield; it now has concerned itself with the nation."

As we enter the final stretch of Academic Year (AY) 2025, Eisenhower's charge to our institution remains central to the activity of the College. Our school, centers, institutes, and programs remain committed to the nation, through excellence in education, significant support to the Army, connecting world renowned talent by virtue of our acknowledged hosting expertise, and in our continuing effort to create a community of academic and non-academic activity that unleashes the potential of all who work and live at Carlisle Barracks.

These enduring commitments manifest themselves in a myriad of ways in the daily life of the College. The mission to develop strategic leaders remains unchanged but what we teach and how we teach must continuously adapt to reflect the ever evolving and

changing character of warfare. As Eisenhower noted in 1966, the scope of military education then at the College required expansion to include not just tactical proficiency, but a deep understanding of the nation's broader strategic ends and the means required to achieve them. Today, we must continually adjust our curriculum to incorporate advanced education in areas of artificial intelligence, machine learning, cyber security, space operations, and other emerging high and low-cost technologies—and we are doing just that through many initiatives and priorities.

We've established AY27 as our aim point to deliver Assessment-Based Tailorable Education (ABTE), preserving the professional body of knowledge we've long stewarded, while offering increased flexibility to customize learning to individual needs and preference. We're already championing new hybrid education models that blend in-person and distance learning. These initiatives, along with others, ensure our education system remains at the forefront of military strategy and leadership development.

The impact of our research, publishing, and outreach continues to expand in both traditional and new media forms. Before AY25 ends this summer, we will have once again hosted a Homeland Security Conference, a Civil-Military Relations Conference, and a Strategic Landpower Symposium. I encourage you to also remain connected with your War College by engaging with the range of podcasts available for consumption on a wide array of topics.

Outside of our classrooms, Carlisle Barracks continues to undergo significant physical changes as well. In partnership with the Garrison staff, we are updating our installation master plan to build on the considerable progress achieved since we broke ground on the new Root Hall in 2020. Our goal is to cast a vision for the next phase in campus modernization that will continue to energize the Carlisle experience for all who interact with our 266-year-old military encampment.

I hope all graduates are as excited as we are that the planning of the Alumni Hall and Park project continues to accelerate. The construction of the Hall and Park, along with refurbishment of the memorial on Forbes Avenue, will provide a modern home for class gifts of stained glass and art, coupled with space for chronologically-sequenced class graduation plaques. Future classes will benefit greatly from this venue, one we envision to help mark significant professional milestones such as promotions and retirements as well as a beautiful setting for USAWC ceremonies and conferencing.

I encourage all friends of the Army War College to make the journey back to Carlisle to visit the new Root Hall and observe the construction of the new Alumni Hall and Park. Your Army War College continues to modernize and innovate while remaining true to our purpose established by our founder Elihu Root, and reinforced for more than a century by graduates like Eisenhower. I consider it a privilege to serve as the 53<sup>rd</sup> Commandant as we continue the incredibly important work of our Army and Nation.

# MESSAGE FROM THE PROVOST

Dear all,

As I write this, 2025 is well underway and we are looking forward to spring. We have several different initiatives across the College, many of which have tremendous potential. Perhaps the most significant is the introduction of Assessment-Based Tailorable Education (ABTE) in AY27. Dean Ed Kaplan and the staff and faculty of the School of Strategic Landpower are working on a concept that will fundamentally change the nature of our curricular offerings. The intent is to switch from a supply-based curricular model to one that is more demand-driven. The result is a range of course options that offer many different avenues to attain a common set of program learning outcomes.

At full operational capacity, a student will take a battery of assessments that will identify individual strengths and opportunities for improvement. This information will help inform a tailored educational experience that allows each student to get the most from the program of instruction. There will be a robust choice of courses ranging from our traditional level survey courses to ones that are more advanced. There will also be options for how faculty choose to teach a course. For example, a course on the theory of war and strategy might be taught the traditional way in one seminar, taught via a problem-based approach in another, and taught using historical case studies from the First World War in a third, all attaining the same outcomes. The staff and faculty are using AY26 to set conditions and pilot courses for full implementation in AY27. This change requires a lot of effort, but we are confident that the results will be worth the work.

In other news, I want to thank the Faculty Senate for their continued support and excellent work. The Senate recently proposed very helpful changes to our policies on faculty management and faculty awards, which were fully accepted. The Faculty Senate President is a voting member of the Academic and Research Board, as well as the Root Hall Governance Board. The Senate's Credentialing Committee reviews academic promotion packets quarterly, spending considerable time reviewing submissions and making thoughtful recommendations. Our next request is that the Senate provide recommendations on updating our retired faculty recognition policy. These are just a few examples of how we are striving to incorporate shared governance into our daily activities.

A key line of effort for the Army War College is extending our impact on the security profession by connecting with international partners through our expertise. These efforts pay off in dividends that are often unforeseen but can have significant impact. This year we completed a seven-year Africa Military Education Program (AMEP) partnership with the Army War College of Nigeria that has seen that College mature to a regional leader in professional military education. Many thanks to Dr. Brett Weigle, RES'07 for bringing this program to a successful conclusion! We are also excited to announce that we are beginning a new partnership program with the military of Zambia. Thanks go to Dr. Alex Marino (SSL) and COL Tim Baer, RES '18 (AHEC) for agreeing to lead this effort. I also want to thank Dr. Mike Neiberg (SSL) for agreeing to serve as academic lead for the NATO Defense Education Enhancement Program (DEEP) for the Colombian National War College and Dr. Ric Killian, DDE '11 (Provost Office) for leading the DEEP effort in Morocco. These programs all serve as vehicles to share best practices across nations and deepen our understanding of one another.

These are just a small selection of actions that illustrate how the USAWC is working to remain relevant and engaged in an ever-changing security environment. Our commitment to excellence in education, research, and international collaboration ensures that we continue to develop leaders who are well-prepared to address the complex challenges of the future. By embracing innovative educational models like ABTE, fostering shared governance through the Faculty Senate, and expanding our global partnerships, we are positioning the Army War College as a leader in professional military education. We are proud of the dedication and hard work of our faculty, staff, and students, and we look forward to the

continued success and growth of our programs. Together, we are building a stronger, more resilient institution that will continue to make a significant impact on the security profession for years to come.

# INTERNATIONAL FELLOWS CONTINUING EDUCATION PROGRAM (IFCEP)

Continuing Education Program (IFCEP) in Zambia, culminating in a week-long symposium in September 2024. The IFCEP focuses on strengthening regional connections and supporting State, DoD, and partner nation objectives by building upon a pre-established foundation of trust to enable increased mutual access and the free exchange of ideas and information between senior military leaders.

This year's event brought together 15 participants from 12 partner nations. Notably, the course expanded its inclusion of U.S. graduates to include four National Guard members from the State Partnership Program states of Massachusetts, North Carolina, North Dakota, and Utah. Throughout the week, the group heard from experienced guest speakers and discussed perspectives on varied topics including the role of NCOs in professionalism, global competition, energy security, and the relationship between civilian and military leadership.

The USAWC hosted the fifth iteration of its International Fellows IFCEP has created a foundation to broaden engagement strategies with our IF graduates, providing continued strategic education, incorporating diverse real-world perspectives back to the College, and maintaining a strong academic network to facilitate senior leadership regionally and globally. As the program expands, the College plans to conduct two events annually, visiting each of the geographic areas of responsibility every three years. IFCEP begins its second iteration of continuing education events visiting alumni from the Western Hemisphere and Europe, planning to hold the next face-to-face symposiums in Lima, Peru and Vilnius, Lithuania, respectively.

#### WAR ROOM UPDATE

War Room, the Army War College's online journal, continues to support USAWC's mission by producing relevant content and showcasing the latest developments at Carlisle Barracks for a diverse and growing audience. Currently, over 11,500 individuals subscribe to the e-mail list, while the average podcast is downloaded about 1,000 times within seven days of release. To put that into context, that puts the Better Peace podcast in about the top 10% of all podcasts on any topic.

In this current academic year, we were pleased to host a series of discussions about some of the special programs and immersive experiences here, such as the Carlisle Scholars and Advanced Strategic Art programs. Alumni who would like to know about the current structure

and curriculum will find these podcasts interesting. This first QR code will take you to those discussions and similar articles and podcasts to catch up on developments at Carlisle Barracks.



The Army Chief of Staff has launched an initiative, the Harding Project, to improve professional writing. Of course, *War Room* is one of the top venues for soldiers of all ranks to publish their work. Additionally, we hosted two podcast discussions about military writing. Editor-in-Chief **JP Clark**, **RES '20**, sat down with two of the leaders of the Harding Project, LTC Zach Griffiths and CPT Theo Lipsky.

# 2<sup>nd</sup> Annual Homeland Defense Symposium: This We'll Defend

The U.S. Army War College hosted the 2nd Annual Homeland Defense Symposium at Carlisle Barracks February 18-20, 2025. In honor of the Army's 250<sup>th</sup> birthday, the theme of this year's conference was "This We'll Defend." Like last year's event, led by CSL's Homeland Defense and Security Issues (HDSI) group, the symposium included panels of experts during the plenary sessions, breakout seminars to discuss major challenges, and senior general officers as keynote speakers. These included **Gen Randall Reed, USAF**, CG of U.S. Transportation Command, and **LTG Allan Pepin**, CG of U.S. Army North. **LTG (Ret) John R. Evans** (CSA Sr. Fellow '15), former CG of U.S. Army North, served as the senior mentor for the symposium.

Collaborating with the Center for Homeland Defense and Security at the Naval Postgraduate School and the Homeland Defense Institute at the U.S. Air Force Academy, the organizers examined a different theme each day. The first day considered the challenges associated with intelligence collection in the homeland. The second explored the vital role that homeland security fusion centers could perform in a homeland defense scenario. The final day was focused on the authorities necessary to enable homeland defense operations. Podcasts with some of the symposium presenters will be available in future episodes of the College's *War Room* blog over the coming weeks, and the conference proceedings will be published within six months.

# JLASS Renamed NSEC<sup>3</sup>

What was formerly known as the Joint Land Air Sea Strategic Special Program or JLASS-SP, is now the National Security Simulation Exercise of Competition, Crisis, and Conflict, the NSEC<sup>3</sup> program.

This 42-year-old program started as a collaborative exercise program between the Carlisle Barracks-based Army War College and the Maxwell AFB-based Air War College and it was first called "CAR-MAX." As it expanded and evolved to include other professional military education institutions, it became the Joint Land Air Sea Strategic or JLASS program. For most of its existence, JLASS looked at regional scenarios but in the last decade, it focused on a global scenario at the national strategic and theater strategic level. The new name more appropriately describes this evolution.

NSEC<sup>3</sup> is now a large, collaborative program with the Army War College's own Resident, Distance, and Blended Education Program students, three other U.S. Senior Service Colleges, and four international partner professional military education institutions. All the students across these institutions are placed in the roles of strategic leaders at the Combatant Command Level and above to address an array of global challenges to national security in a world set 10 years in the future. Students are presented with a strategic problem set which simultaneously presents Competition, Crisis, and even Conflict

across the globe and then asked how they as strategic leaders will develop options to ensure U.S., ally, and partner national interests.

The culmination of the NSEC<sup>3</sup> program is the collective exercise hosted the last week of April at Carlisle in the new Root Hall. Approximately 150 students and 50 supporting faculty and exercise control personnel come in person from across the partner institutions and programs for this meaningful role-playing event.

NSEC<sup>3</sup> has hit the ground running this year with lectures in December from LTG (Ret) Reynold Hoover, DDE'03 on his senior mentor reflections from last year's JLASS exercise, and his expectations as the CEO of LA Olympics 2028. Former Provost, Dr. Jim Breckenridge, continues in his exercise role assignment as President McGraw. This year's event is focused on AFRICOM with advice and assistance from former Commander of AFRICOM, GEN (Ret) Stephen J. Townsend, RES'03.

# The Theater Army Staff Course Enters Fourth Year

In just three short years, CSL's Theater Army Staff Course (TASC) has emerged as one of the U.S. Army War College's premier outreach programs. Since launching the pilot course at U.S. Army North at the end of November 2021, the TASC has conducted 16 iterations, educating over 650 students on theater-army operations. The TASC was designed to address an identified professional military education gap between division/ corps and strategic education. By filling this gap, the College helps commands at the critical theater-army echelon reduce the long learning curve for theater-army staff members, contributing to the Army's increased effectiveness at the operational through strategic levels in competition, crisis, Additionally, with the and conflict. reemerging focus given to large-scale combat operations, the TASC shores up the knowledge of the critical theater army-level provisions necessary for operations on such a scale.

The TASC program began by providing the course in partnership with—and on-site at the five theater armies around the world and has since grown by adding two courses: one in conjunction with U.S. Army Europe and Africa at NATO Allied Land Command in Izmir, Türkiye in early spring, and the other in the summer at Carlisle Barracks. Though the Carlisle TASC pulls students from each of the five theater armies, the TASC is also open to commands and agencies that have significant theater-army equities but whose personnel may not necessarily be assigned to a theater army. Over the past two years, the Carlisle TASC has been well attended by organizations such as the U.S. Army Forces Command, the U.S. Army Nuclear and Countering Weapons of Mass Destruction Agency, the U.S. Army Combined Arms Center, the Military Surface Deployment and Distribution Command, the U.S. Army Reserve Command/Office of the Chief of Army Reserve, the Army National Guard, and others.

The TASC's target audience consists of the ranks of captain (O-3) through lieutenant colonel (O-5), warrant officers (CW2–CW5), civilians at or equivalent to general schedule 12–13, and senior noncommissioned officers (E-7–E-9). But actual enrollment remains flexible to the needs and realities of personnel at each command, to include both partner and allied forces and civilians. The demand signals from and operational necessities of the theater armies resulted in a mobile-training-team delivery format with the curriculum

tailored to each theater army. The course relies on local subject matter experts to provide the area of responsibility-specific components of the curriculum. This outreach concept has proven highly effective and further cements the College's relationships with all theater armies and their respective theater-enabling commands.

CSL provides doctrine overviews, learning objectives, and distance-learning curricula delivered over Blackboard during phase I of the course. Phase II is a one-week resident session with a highly qualified expert senior mentor with theater-army experience. Lessons are focused on: theater-army history; doctrine and U.S. Code Title X functions; executive-agent functions; Army support to other services; headquarters functions and staff structure; the Unified Command Plan and theater strategy; the Theater Campaign Support Plan; command and control of theater-level operations; protection in the theater army; setting the theater for sustainment and intelligence; theater security cooperation; joint reception, staging, onward movement, and integration; and more. Faculty are drawn from CSL and the College's various schools, centers, institutes, and programs, with the Peacekeeping and Stability Operations Institute and both the College's Department of Distance Education and the Department of Military Strategy, Planning, and Operations providing major faculty participants.

The purpose of the TASC is to educate students on what the theater army is and does, enabling understanding across the staff and increased effectiveness in the execution of both theater-strategic and operational-level coordination and planning. The NATO Allied Land Command TASC takes the TASC's examination of what a theater army is and does and extends it to what NATO's theater army-equivalent structure should be as NATO works on defining its role. Similarly, though on a much more limited scale, the TASC has caused theater armies to discover gaps between what they do and what they should do, resulting in organizational changes. Throughout the TASC, students examine how the various theater-army entities operate and interact and how the theater army addresses operational- through strategic-level landpower imperatives for the Joint Force across all warfighting functions in environments from competition to crisis and even to conflict and back.

The TASC program continues to iterate and innovate, providing an outstanding, tailored education and training experience, bridging theater-strategic and operational levels of war. As a newer addition to and refinement

of the original model with practical exercises, CSL's Department of Strategic Wargaming has partnered with the TASC program to create a Theater Army Responsibilities War Game (U.S. Indo-Pacific Command version) that has been executed twice at the U.S. Army Pacific TASC and once at the Carlisle TASC. Other versions for the remaining courses are either under development or in the planning phase. The addition of a war game to the TASC also ensures staff are familiar with and ready to use such methodologies in their planning and decision-making processes.

# De Serio Chair of Theater and Strategic Intelligence

During his first six months as the De Serio Chair of Theater and Strategic Intelligence, **Dr. Thomas Spahr**, **RES'19** taught, published,

and represented USAWC in a wide range of activities. The Foundation is very pleased to have Dr. Spahr in this important position serving the College in memory of **Mr. Francis W. De Serio, RES '72**. The Chair was established with the generous support of his widow Charlotte Heuer Watts and the Russell Pearce Heuer and Elizabeth Crimian Heuer Foundation.

Dr. Spahr's Summer 2024 Parameter's article "Raven Sentry: Employing AI for Indications and Warning in Afghanistan" is one of the top ten most downloaded articles published by Parameters, the U.S. Army War College Quarterly. It has echoed widely across government and academia, including an article published in The Economist Magazine on July 31, 2024 titled "How America built an AI tool to predict Taliban attacks." The Strategic Studies Institute podcast that accompanied his article was featured on multiple outlets, including the 7th Army Training Command website, the U.S. Air Force's Empowered Airmen website, and the First Army Division West website.

Dr. Spahr developed a "Role of Intelligence at Gettysburg" staff ride last fall and delivered it twice for the leadership of the National Ground Intelligence Center and the Army G2 (Intelligence). The Army G2 asked him to design and deliver a similar intel-focused event at Antietam in the spring.





Dr. Spahr has also been a regular host of "A Better Peace," the USAWC War Room podcast. He hosted a series of podcasts with leaders involved in incorporating technology and artificial intelligence into command and control, intelligence, and fires. His guests included **Dr. Alex Miller**, the chief technology advisor to the Chief of Staff of the Army, and **COL** (**Ret**) **Joe O'Callaghan**, the architect of the Maven Smart System, an AI-fueled Intelligence and Fires system employed in the XVIII Airborne Corps, the Security Assistance Group-Ukraine, and several other joint commands. On January 31, Dr. Spahr took a group of 10 of his students studying technology and AI to visit Palantir and the National Geospatial-Intelligence Agency.

Dr. Spahr hosted Gen Kenneth 'Frank' McKenzie, USMC, Ret., the former commander of U.S. Central Command, on February 3rd for a talk with students (Resident, Distance, and Fellows) and then for an event at the Army Heritage and Education Center about McKenzie's new book *The Melting Point: High Command and War in the 21st Century*. Dr. Spahr's review of the book appeared in the Autumn 2024 edition of *Parameters*.





Dr. Spahr has arranged for **GEN** (**Ret**) **Paul M. Nakasone**, **RES** '07, former Commander of the National Security Agency and U.S. Cyber Command, to deliver this year's De Serio lecture on Strategic Intelligence on March 24, 2025.

### **Chair of War Studies**

**Dr. Michael Neiberg** hosted distinguished British historian **Sir Hew Strachan** and his wife for a tour of Gettysburg in September 2024 and coordinated some additional engagements for him at the College. Strachan held a session with students based on "Theory of War and Strategy" curriculum themes around how wars start, how alliances function, and how wars end, with considerable discussion about the works of Thucydides and Clausewitz. He also spoke to the faculty and shared his insights from past British Defence Reviews. He presented his work on this topic in mid-October 2024 to a seminar at the University of North Texas. He had spent a week in London earlier talking with British institutions who are also interested in AI for the analysis of strategy and its uses in the humanities more generally.





He has a busy spring ahead, which will include assuming a key role in the NATO Defense Education Enhancement Partnership with the country of Colombia. This program is a NATO initiative that helps partner countries build and reform their military educational institutions.

My Toughest Battle: A Soldier's Lifelong Struggle with Polio by MG William M. Matz, Jr., RES'80. This memoir describes the life and service of an infantryman and paratrooper in times of peace and war, and candidly


reveals how he was able to achieve his goals while battling the debilitating effects of polio. He served in the DMZ in Korea, led troops in combat in Vietnam, was wounded in the Tet Offensive, received the Distinguished Service Cross for Valor, and led troops again during the Panama invasion—all while wearing a specially fitted combat boot and a foot orthotic device on his atrophied "polio leg." Later duties include serving as Executive Secretary to the SECDEF during the Reagan years and retiring as a MG in 1995 and working in the administrations of three Presidents. Keeping veterans' causes close to heart, he led the fight on behalf of the wounded, disabled, and their families as a member of the Veterans Disability Benefits Commission and as President of the National Association for Uniformed Services, and as Secretary of the American Battle Monuments Commission.



Are They Out There? by COL (Ret) Gene P. Abel, DCS '85.

This book tackles the question, "Is there intelligent life in the Universe?" The author writes that until humanity reaches a level of

technology to bypass the physical boundaries of light speed, the most we can do is look out at the stars and attempt to explore the planets around us. Barring that, we can only hope that an extraterrestrial species advanced enough to travel the stars comes to visit us and questions the possibility that Earth has already been visited by such beings. He provides fascinating information from the recent Congressional hearings that has shown some convincing information about the existence of UFOs. He looks into the distant past and what our ancestors saw thousands of years ago and takes a deep dive into Roswell as well as several other reported UFO crashes.




Our World Without Hitler: It Will Astonish You by COL (Ret) Gene P. Abel, DCS '85. This historical timetravel novel explores the question, "What if WWII never took place?" This is the story

of what happened when Sam Weiss, while exploring a cave, discovers a time portal and convinces his friend Ben and their girlfriends to return to May 1919. The girls remain in San Jose and discover what life is like one hundred years earlier in their hometown while the boys travel to New York and on to Germany to prevent Hitler from becoming Chancellor of Germany. When the four of them return to San Jose in 2018, what greets them is a reality that looks like it was lifted from the 1960s, and only one finds she has a reality in the new 2018. They finally realize that they were successful in preventing the war and are now faced with what this means to them and the world.

A Soldier's Journey: Living His Why, 2<sup>nd</sup> Edition by LTG (Ret) Lawson W. Magruder III, RES'86. This is an updated edition to the lessons and insights Magruder acquired as the son of a soldier, and

during a successful career as an Army combat leader, and later as the co-founder of True Growth, a successful and valued leadership development practice. You will find personal triumphs, and at times personal failures. Candor and frankness, as well as humility, and a willingness to admit shortcomings show how values are developed or sometimes discovered.



In The Orchards of Our Mothers by Mr. Arthur W. McMaster III, RES '86. This work of historical fiction is set in the final two years of the war in Europe with French resistance fighter Jacques Berlangier and his determined


American OSS partner, Claire Skiffington, as they struggle to survive a series of hazardous assignments in support of Allied operations. In the war's immediate aftermath, in love and together in Paris, they decide to return to his family's apple farm business in the Breton countryside. There, residual and unforeseen trouble rivals the dangers they thought were well past. Revenge, murderous alliances, and heroic efforts from unexpected sources propel the action.



In Strange Company: An American Soldier with Multinational Forces in the Middle East and Iraq by COL (Ret) Roland J. Tiso, Jr., RES '94. This offers unique insights into the challenges of planning the Iraqi campaign and

the intricacies and challenges of multinational service through the lens of the author's assignments as a war planner at U.S. Central Command, Senior Military Adviser of the Arab Peninsula Shield Force and the Polishled Multinational Division (Central-South), and Chief of Staff and Deputy Chief of Staff for Operations (C-3) of the Coalition Military Assistance Training Team tasked to develop the New Iraqi Army. His observations cast significant light on the missions these units undertook and the challenges they confronted.


His firsthand account of operational planning for war in Iraq captures the concerns of the military planners and senior commanders to liberate and stabilize the country, enabling the reader to better understand the challenges of operational war planning, coalition warfare, the difficulty of stabilizing Iraq after the fall of Baghdad, the development of the New Iraqi Army, and ultimately a deeper understanding of America's "long war" in Iraq.



Guest of Adolf: The War of SSG Ernest V. Focht, 805<sup>th</sup> Tank Destroyer Battalion by COL (Ret) Michael H. Zang, DDE '98. American soldier Ernest

American soldier Ernest Focht, who spent 27 months as a prisoner of war


(POW) during World War II, said, "I was a guest of Adolf!" when asked about his wartime experience. He was born and brought up in Tyrone, Pennsylvania. He was drafted into the Pennsylvania Army National Guard in April 1941 and assigned to the 105th Infantry Battalion (Anti-Tank). After training, he participated in the Carolina Maneuvers and the National Guard unit was redesignated as the 805th Tank Destroyer Battalion, and deployed to North Africa in January 1943. He was captured in his first action in February 1943, remaining a POW until May 1945 when the Russian Army liberated his camp. He was held in five different POW camps and was forced to march between camps in the depths of the 1944-45 winter. Using his wartime diaries and letters home, this book offers an insight into the 805th Tank Destroyer Battalion, and the experiences of POWs.



Letters from Baghdad Vol. 2, Herding Cats by COL (Ret) Michael P. Courts, RES'03. This volume continues sharing Courts' Iraq experiences through weekly letters. During the 2009-10 period, he deployed as Deputy

Chief of Staff (DCOS) for I Corps as the HQs assumed the role of Multi-National Corps-Iraq (MNC-I). His role and experiences were very different from his first tour covered in Vol 1. As 2009 began, the U.S. experienced a change in leadership and guidance from the Bush to the Obama Administration, and the Iraq mission from a multi-national effort to a U.S.-only mission. The U.S. began a planned drawdown, consolidating six major

HQs into one. He worked closely with his counterparts at the other major HQs to plan the drawdown and consolidation and develop an organizational structure that could satisfy the mission requirements while meeting the prescribed workforce limitations. The relationship with Iraqi forces changed as more responsibility was transferred to the Iraqis. He was also responsible for the internal workings of a 1200-man staff (hence the subtitle "Herding Cats") where daily life was never dull. Like Vol. 1, Vol. 2 contains weekly lessons learned that help understand the broader implications of the mission in Iraq.



After the Butterfly: I Heard You God by Dr. Cheryl McAuley, RES'05. Blending lessons in discipleship with touching vignettes of her ministry, McAuley highlights the importance of finding your purpose


in life. She felt compelled to dig into vital nonprofit organizations. She asked herself if visiting wounded warrior retreats across America would show her a unique way for veterans to heal. The vivid descriptions of the healing she witnessed offer fresh hope to former military members and their families, first responders, and Christians trying to find renewed meaning. 
Choose your Battles:


The China-Russian Relationship: The Dance of the Dragon and the Bear by COL (Ret) Robert E. Hamilton, Ph.D., USAWCF'09. This book takes a new approach to examining the relationship between China and Russia,

departing from the standard debate over whether the relationship is a true strategic partnership or merely an axis of convenience. Instead, the book argues that the best way to gain an understanding of ties between Beijing and Moscow is to watch how they interact "on the ground" in regions of the world where they both have important interests at stake. It provides an in-depth analysis of Chinese-Russian interaction in Africa, Central Asia, and East Asia, as well as an analysis of China's response to Russia's invasion of Ukraine. The picture of the relationship that emerges portrays its dynamic, complex, and contingent nature, and reveals areas of convergence and divergence between these two powers. In doing so, it provides a new perspective useful to both scholars and policymakers.




Inside the Wire:

In what has become the never-ending Global War on Terrorism, a consequence often forgotten is that the U.S. must be prepared to handle captured and surrendering enemies. Combatants or non-combatant civilians, they become our "EPWs" — Enemy Prisoners of War — who must be housed, clothed, fed, and protected for months or even years. One of the U.S. military's most experienced officers in detention operations, having served in Desert Storm, Iraq, Afghanistan, and Guantanamo Bay, Hussey's experiences as the commander at Abu Ghraib and DCG at Guantanamo Bay (GTMO) gave him a first-hand view of the challenges of operating EPW camps. This describes his career in the military and his rise through the ranks to take on these leadership roles at Abu Ghraib and GTMO, plus how troops must prepare for detention operations, how EPW camps must be designed, how soldiers must learn to deal with prison riots and enemy attacks, and how the U.S. must be better prepared for EPW operations in the future.



You're a Good Man, Sergeant: The WWII Combat Memoir of an Armored Infantryman in Patton's Third Army (Paul S. Porter) edited by Colleen C. Porter and Don M. Fox, NSS '15. This is the memoir of SGT Paul S.

Porter who served with the Fourth Armored Division in Company B, 53rd Armored Infantry Battalion in a light machine gun squad that entered the front line of World War II on July 17, 1944. The Fourth fought through the hedgerows of Normandy before leading Patton's Third Army in its breakout and pursuit toward the German border. The slugfests that followed as the Fourth advanced through the mud and battered villages of the Alsace-Lorraine region were Porter's most difficult of the war. For his heroic actions in combat on December 4, 1944, he was awarded the Distinguished Service Cross.

# **U.S ARMY HERITAGE AND EDUCATION CENTER (USAHEC)**



In October, the College welcomed **Dr. Kate C. Lemay** to the U.S. Army Heritage and Education Center (USAHEC) as its new director. The Center collects, preserves, and presents the experiences of American soldiers to help the College develop a foundation for strategic thought, as well as educate the public about the history of the U.S. Army. A Fulbright scholar, Dr. Lemay served for nine years as historian and curator at the Smithsonian's

National Portrait Gallery, where she gained extensive experience in envisioning and creating museum initiatives. At the Smithsonian, she led successful military-history focused programming, fundraising, researching, and curating, including the 2024 exhibition 1898: U.S. Imperial Visions and Revisions, which the Washington Post described as "the best and most engaging work the National Portrait Gallery has done in a decade." Dr. Lemay's publications include three books focused on the intersections of art, memory, and military history. She holds a dual Ph.D. in American Art History and American Studies from Indiana University, and she completed an MA in Art History and a BA in French and Art History from Syracuse University, graduating Phi Beta Kappa.

In addition to her practical experience, Dr. Lemay brings a fresh design perspective to the physical spaces of the Center and is working with her team to update both the Ridgway Library and the exterior Event Pavilion. At the same time, she recognizes the need to establish adequate storage areas, assess the collection's strengths and gaps, and continue the momentum the Center has in its digitization efforts. Her goal is to steer USAHEC to capitalize on its world class collections, drawing in War College students and the public alike. Under her direction, the USAHEC will be the professional and public's choice destination to access and understand Army history.

On another front, Army Expo 2024, held September 14 – 15, broke all attendance records with over 7,000 visiting that weekend. Highlights included the Golden Knights, Old Guard Fife and Drum Corps, World War II armor demonstrations, and reenactors on the Army Heritage Trail. USAHEC staff, along with volunteers and partners from around the Army War College and Army writ large, hosted the Expo. Over 500 staff, volunteers, and reenactors offered interactive activities and programs to the public. Planning has begun on Army Expo 2025, September 13 – 14, and we look to topping attendance once again to connect citizens with their Army. We are extremely grateful to the USAWC and Carlisle Barracks teammates for their support.

USAHEC is celebrating Army 250 in 2025 with a full slate of programming throughout the year as well as two new exhibits. These will include a staff-curated Army 250 exhibit at USAHEC and a refreshed exhibit focusing on the history of Carlisle Barracks at the Hessian Powder Magazine. Both exhibits will open to the public on June 14th, the Army Birthday.

Always focused on academic support, **Ms. Heather Goyette**, Branch Chief, Root Hall Branch Library, and **Prof. Greta Braungard**, our Academic Library Department Chair, conducted the inaugural offering of an elective "Getting Back into Research" for 17 Resident students. Lessons focused on research mechanics, outlining, citation formats, evaluation of resources, data and AI, and many other relevant subjects for completion of the capstone Strategic Research Requirement.

Finally, our Student Required Research (SRR) appointments are on track to exceed previous years. The Academic Library Department has completed 158 appointments for students in all modalities. Subjects include readiness, the space domain, suicide prevention, talent management, and many more. These appointments prepare the students for success with their SRRs.

# STRATEGIC STUDIES INSTITUTE (SSI) & THE USAWC PRESS

It has been a busy six months for the Strategic Research and Analysis Department (SRAD) team. As the summer closed out, SSI published the "2024 Annual Estimate of the Strategic Security Environment." Led by MAJ Brennan Devereaux, the estimate included research questions from major commands to help focus student and faculty research efforts. This fall, Dr. John Deni published his co-authored monograph, "The Role of America's European Allies in the Russia-Ukraine War 2022-24," which examined Europe's support of Ukraine and offered insights on future European contributions to Ukraine and to the strategic competition with Russia and China. Dr. Tony Pfaff published his monograph, "Bargaining for Justice: Ukraine, Gaza, and the Ethics of Conflict Termination," which examined the potential for a negotiated end to ongoing conflicts through the lens of just war and game theory.







In December, **Dr. Evan Ellis** received an award from the Interamerican Institute for Democracy (IID) based on his continued work exploring challenges to democracy and democratic states in Latin America. In January, the team welcomed **Dr. Jacob Stoil** as our new Research Professor of Middle Eastern Studies. He joins the SSI Team from the School of Advanced Military Studies (SAMS) at Fort Leavenworth. Lastly, the team continues to be in demand from across the national security community,

whether it's being asked to guest teach at the NATO Defense College, lead the Air Chiefs Conference in SOUTHCOM, or present on the spread of malign Chinese influence across the globe.



The China Landpower Studies Center (CLSC) welcomed its newest visiting research professor in September, Dr. Arzan Tarapore from Stanford University. During his year here, his research and publications will focus on Indian military issues culminating in a research project seeking an operational-level net assessment of the India-China military balance on their land border. The project is designed to generate plausible recommendations for U.S. Army security cooperation that can offset Indian vulnerabilities.

The CLSC hosted the 2024 Carlisle Conference on the PLA in October and explored the PRC's views on and capacity to carry out a protracted war in the Indo-Pacific. Nearly a hundred guests from DoD, academia, think tanks, and private industry joined the conference to hear outstanding keynote speakers and expert panels, while also participating in in-depth breakout discussions to debate the key takeaways. CLSC Director COL Rich Butler, RES '16 served as host and master of ceremonies. Dr. Arzan Tarapore moderated the first panel on the PRC's understanding of protracted war that featured Dr. Jake Rinaldi presenting his research on PLA lessons learned from other countries' modern protracted conflicts. Jake Vartanian participated in the second panel to discuss his research on PLA operational endurance in the land domain. The third panel, moderated by CLSC Chair Joshua Arostegui, featured Rick Gunnell's research on Chinese strategic-level command and control during a protracted war. Finally, Dr. Sheena Greitens moderated the fourth panel on opportunities for PRC cooperation with partners during a protracted war, and included Dr. Brian Carlson, who presented his work on what the PRC likely expected from partner states. The conference was impactful for many audiences, and we look forward to repeating the success this coming fall.

papers, and faculty-student group research projects. Parameters Bookshelf, our online book review feature now in its third year, continues to grow with 40 book reviews published in 2024. 

## **Eisenhower Series College Program Turns 55**

In 1969, the College established the Current Affairs Panel as an academic outreach program to encourage dialogue on national security and other public policy issues with the civilian public, with emphasis on students and faculty at colleges and universities throughout the U.S. The program was renamed the Eisenhower Series College Program (ESCP) in 2005 and continues its mission today in this 55th anniversary year. In commemoration of this program, we share a seminal event that merits attention still today.

On May 8th, 1970, some 200 Dickinson College students held a sit-in outside the USAWC gate to protest the fatal May 4th shootings at Kent State University.

The initial tension and standoff dissipated when a few participants of that first Current Affairs Panel came out to speak to them. One of them was LTC Robert L. Schweitzer, RES '70, a recipient of two silver stars and seven purple hearts, and he persuaded the students to join him and his colleagues in dialogue in nearby grassy areas. After two to three hours, the gathering ended peacefully. LTC Schweitzer later retired at the rank of LTG.

New ESCP faculty and students each year are coached to engage with similar humility and openness as was evident with the Dickinson College engagement 55 years ago. In January 2025, ESCP faculty and students shared the inspiring story of the May 8<sup>th</sup> protest with current students at Kent State, explaining how the tragedy there 55 years ago helped create an enduring legacy of constructive engagement since.

I am retiring this summer after 30 years of service in the U.S. Air Force and 5 years as the Director of ESCP. As I pass the ESCP torch to its next director, I hope the program has at least another 55 years of honoring the legacy of May 8th, 1970.

# SPECIAL TRIBUTE

**COL (Ret) David Jablonsky, Ph.D.** *July* 2, 1938 – *January* 9, 2025



This exceptionally gifted Army War College author and faculty member served the College for almost 20 years and greatly influenced the education of both students and faculty.

David shared his deep knowledge of national security affairs, as well as "the art of how to teach" with so many of us. His interest in national security led him to develop one of the most popular electives offered, a negotiations course that challenged students with difficult international issues. He was a master at drawing out even the most introverted types with a technique he passed along one day as we were discussing teaching methods. He said, "Rather than asking hard questions, consider sharing such He could do that by raising the topic indirectly, suggesting something like, "I was thinking about a problem this morning and frankly I'm at a loss as to what I think about it." He cautioned that this could never come across as a gimmick so it was important to honestly admit that no one had all the answers. If it was genuinely a technique in pursuit of insights, it never ceased to get a discussion going and resulted in seminar learning. Sometimes referred to as the "Socratic Method," David's way of teaching taught me a lot, both about him and Socrates, as well.

David was a talented writer on national security affairs, producing articles for publication that annually won faculty writing awards. Indeed, he won the award so frequently I petitioned the Academic Dean to name the award after him (that did not happen). David was also hugely interested in the life and career of Winston Churchill, authoring a book on young Churchill's exploits that laid the foundation for his emergence as politician and later war lord during WWII.

David was also a gifted lecturer, called upon each year to deliver a lecture to the entire War College class about the decades between the first and second World Wars. The lecture was always well received and masterfully delivered, seeming natural and collegial as if he was sharing a few insights with an intimate group instead of a large audience of all students and faculty. One day while preparing a presentation I was to deliver in Bliss Hall, I walked into the empty auditorium to find David up on the stage, strolling about while rehearsing the entire lecture, word for word, stopping now and again to rework a phrase or substitute a word. I realized what had appeared as almost extemporaneous was a carefully crafted gem of a presentation. His lectures were uniformly brilliant because they were grounded on diligent preparation, not only for what he had to say, but how he said it.

Over time I came to believe that someone who served on the faculty of the Army War College should possess three attributes or qualities. First, they should be thoroughly knowledgeable in the material they were responsible for teaching. Second, they should be a reliable member of the department in which they served, willing and able to serve on faculty committees, as lesson authors, be available for students seeking guidance or assistance, and be ready to perform the inevitable range of extra duties necessary for an academic department. Finally, they should be a good colleague, someone available to members of the faculty looking for advice and counsel. David was first among equals when it came to all three of these attributes, especially the last.

David Jablonsky was one of the most admired persons on the faculty and will be remembered as such for as long as there are former students and colleagues who had the privilege to know him, and thanks to his writing, long after that. It is often said, almost casually, that so and so is a "national treasure." David Jablonsky is and will always be the measure by which I determine who is deserving of that recognition.

COL (Ret) William J. Flavin June 1, 1946 — November 16, 2024

COL (Ret) 'Bill' Flavin, USAWCF '91, a distinguished leader and advocate for global peace and stability, passed away leaving a remarkable legacy. A 31-year Army veteran, Bill served in key leadership roles, including Deputy Director of Special Operations for SHAPE, and Special Operations Chair at the U.S. Army War College, with deployments ranging from Vietnam to the Balkans. He later dedicated 17 years to the U.S. Army Peacekeeping and Stability Operations Institute (PKSOI), shaping U.S. peace initiatives and collaborating with government agencies, the United Nations, and international organizations to promote stability in conflictaffected regions. His expertise in both conventional and special operations, coupled with his deep understanding of military strategy and diplomacy, were valued by his students, friends, and colleagues around the world.

Bill's commitment to service, contributions to promoting peace, and dedication to fostering global cooperation touched countless individuals and institutions. His work at PKSOI significantly advanced peacekeeping doctrine and practices, shaping strategies that continue to guide U.S. engagement in complex environments. A recognized alumnus of the Virginia Military Institute, teaching at the Army War College and leading PKSOI were the culmination of a distinguished career. Bill will be remembered for his remarkable accomplishments, integrity, humility, and lasting relationships, leaving behind a legacy that will inspire future generations.
