U.S. ARMY WAR COLLEGE COMMANDANT'S UPDATE

October 30, 2018

From MG John Kem, 51st Commandant

Hello again from the War College. I hope this message finds you all well and as enthused as I am about your Army War College and our many recent events and efforts.

Since I sent my last note, Academic Year 19 is in full swing. We are excited about the new cohort of rising strategic leaders—from the new cohort of the non-resident and resident course to our Basic Strategic Arts Program students to the many executive education General Officer students. In addition, over the summer and early fall, the staff and faculty of our schools, centers, and institutes have continued our aggressive journey to look at what the Army War College of the 2020s and 2030s should be. We are collectively examining what is changing in the landscape of national security, adult education, and the competitive forces that should help guide us and drive our efforts.

Toward that end, we have embarked on a faculty and staff effort to engage across the U.S. and internationally for a few months on best practices, not just within professional military education, but across the public and private sectors, in the areas of our institutional learning outcomes and other areas where we should be paying close attention. We will share what we learn in the coming months and see where it takes us.

For me personally, I am continually amazed by the level of worldwide interest and support in what we are doing and the recognition of our unique mission. We have a large number of noted institutions that want to partner with us in new efforts or deepen existing relationships. For example, I recently had the honor of speaking at the Disruptive Technology for Defense Transformation Conference in London and the NeuroLeadership Institute annual conference/summit in New York. Both engagements illustrated the value of our efforts and what we can share in leadership and national security efforts—and what we can learn from others who are driving innovation in their professions.

As always, we love to share pictures of our experiences. I want to make special mention of our Australian allies who invited me to serve as the E. G. Keogh Visiting Chair and present the annual Keogh Lecture in Canberra. The visit was a truly unique experience

for both the sharing of ideas and for being able to see such a beautiful country. The visit culminated in Sydney with the 40th anniversary reunion of Australian officers who have attended the U.S. Army War College. The group meets annually and the most recent graduate has to tell stories of their year at the War College and the graduate from the year prior to that has to organize the event. It is a great tradition that keeps the connections to Carlisle and each other strong.

Regretfully, we are also saying farewell to BG Mark O'Donnell and COL Gregg Thompson. BG O'Donnell has made tremendous efforts in improving the entire GO education system. He is off to become the Deputy Commanding General - Support of the 82nd Airborne. Our Chief of Staff, COL Thompson, is retiring after a distinguished career. We wish both of them the very best.

Congratulations to our two "just graduated" cohorts of the Class of 2018 -- 380 Resident Education Program (REP) and 371 Distance Education Program (DEP) graduates. Linked to each group are our fabulous colleagues from across American society who joined us for the National Security Seminar (NSS as part of the REP) and the Commandant's National Security Program (CNSP with the DEP). NSS highlights included presentations on the instruments of

Congratulations to **Dr. Clay Chun** and the Department of Distance Education for successfully attaining accreditation for Joint Professional Military Education phase II for a subset of the distance program. Students enrolled in the Joint Studies Program (JSP) will receive JPME II credentials. This is retroactive to the first cohort of JSP students in the class of 2017.

We are in the final stages of the reaccreditation process for our Masters degree. The Middle States Commission on Higher Education (MSCHE) will visit USAWC in November for the assessment which occurs every eight years. We have developed a very thorough self-study and have worked closely with MSCHE representatives to look hard at ourselves, assess our programs, and consider refinements to maintain high and rigorous academic standards. So far the indicators are very positive.

The prospects for the construction of a new academic facility to replace Root Hall have also provided a valuable opportunity for us to consider how we lead education into the future. In particular, consideration of the design for the new building has spurred us to closely explore educational techniques and methodologies that innovative classroom and building design might support.

We are very proud of our outstanding faculty who do so much for mission success. The striking combinations of teaching, scholarship, and service provide the core of our endeavors to educate and develop future leaders as well as to advance knowledge in the global application of landpower. This year, several SSL faculty members were recognized for superlative contributions.

Liberty holds a lowered sword demonstrating the will to defend herself. Lady Liberty is fixed to a stone foundation with the inscription "Liberty shall not perish," referencing a 1918 American war bond poster. On the reverse side of the stone, a quote from General John J. Pershing is inscribed.

CARLISLE TOWN BAND PLAYS FOR DDE 2018 GRADUATION

On the warm morning of Friday, July 27, 2018, 35 members of the Carlisle Town Band, led by Band Director Dave Rohrer, were honored to provide musical accompaniment for the Graduation Ceremony for the DDE Class of 2018. During this ceremony, the band performed pre-event patriotic music, musical honors for the guest speaker, the five Service songs, and post-event patriotic selections.

A thriving organization of enthusiastic volunteer musicians, today's Carlisle Town Band traces its roots to the first Carlisle Brass Band, formed in 1844. The band's subsequent history includes service as the 8th Regiment Band and the 104th Cavalry Regiment Band in the Pennsylvania National Guard during the early 20th Century. The band's National Guard Service was highlighted by its active service along the Mexican border in 1916. In 1923, the band was mustered out of the Pennsylvania National Guard and then reformed itself into the Carlisle Town Band. Until the 1960s, the band was a male-only organization, but it now welcomes musicians of all genders, ages and appropriate skill levels.

Several members of the Carlisle Barracks community are active members of this organization; for this concert, the band included **Karin Apgar** (euphonium, spouse of a retired RES '10 grad); **Jim Shufelt, RES '01** (cornet, still a DA Civilian at CSL); **Ben Adelberg** (clarinet, the son of an Army officer in the USAWC G3 section),

and **John McHugh** (trombone, Army retiree and volunteer at the Carlisle Barracks Chapel). Other members with military ties include several retired Service bandsmen and a retired USMC officer, as well as spouses and children. The band also includes music educators and musically-skilled representatives from just about every profession, trade, and business found in the Carlisle area.



The Carlisle Town Band is proud to provide music to the Carlisle-area community. The Band's active concert schedule includes performances at retirement homes throughout the area, public Spring, Fall,



U.S. ARMY WAR COLLEGE FELLOWS UPDATE

The USAWC-administered Fellows Programs comprised of CSA Senior (post-MEL 1) and USAWC Fellows (MEL 1) -- are off to a fast start for AY 2019, with 88 Fellows assigned to 52 separate programs in the U.S. and overseas. The USAWC Fellows' charter is two-fold in terms of Army expectations. The main thrust is for each Fellow to take advantage of a learning environment that is separate and distinct from that which is traditionally offered by the war colleges, and also parlay knowledge gained for the betterment of the Army. That said, they are also pursuing Individual Learning Plans that parallel the learning outcomes expected of their resident student peers in Carlisle. The secondary thrust is for each Fellow to represent the Army, either formally or informally, at the institutions and areas to which they are assigned. Fellowships offer the opportunity to satisfy the Army's goal of developing appropriately-educated ambassadors for the Army who will hold positions of broad scope and great

responsibility, work in highly complex, ambiguous environments,

and deal with problems with no clear-cut solutions.



The CSA Senior Fellows are sent by the Army as seasoned ambassadors of the institution to centers of thought and influence. They assist those who would deliberate on the larger security challenges faced by the nation, and also report back their findings to the senior Army leadership, either to the CSA and VCSA, and individual General Officer-level mentors who have functional or regional interests coincidental with 'their' Fellow's host institution. They are joined by two Sergeants Major who report to the SMA -- one each at the Departments of Education and Labor -- helping the Army in its pursuit of credentialing soldiers in areas in demand in the private sector.





BOOKS BY GRADS AND FACULTY



USAWC Guide to the Battle of Chickamauga, 2d Edition, by COL (Ret) Matt Spruill III, RES '86. Not far from Chattanooga in northern Georgia, the Confederacy won one of its most decisive battles at Chickamauga. This updated and

expanded guide, one of the USAWC Guides to Civil War Battles developed for "staff rides" on key battlefields, describes how this skirmish, only two days long, turned into the second-bloodiest battle of the Civil War with over 34,000 Union and Confederate soldiers killed, wounded, or captured. With extraordinary maps by Tim Kissel to complement Spruill's extensive research, this on-the-ground guide with explicit directions to points of interest—illustrating the action and showing the details of troop positions, roads, rivers, elevations, and tree lines as they were more than 150 years ago—brings the battle to life in the historic setting and context.




Executive Courage: Sometimes You Have to Walk Point by Dr. (Col, Ret) James H. Benson, USMC, RES '87. Benson uses the metaphor of "walking point" to emphasize that organizational longevity and greatness are not achieved by faint-at-heart

executives. Walking point is taking charge of the organization. It involves trusting one's instincts, possessing a propensity to will or determine an outcome through words and action, and having a diminished sense of fear and risk and an insatiable appetite to be the best. There are varying views and philosophies regarding managment schools, colleges, and business turnarounds. Leadership is a dynamic process, and leader skill sets can vary dramatically. However, it takes a bold, decisive, confident, ice-in-the-veins leader to turn around a rapidly failing organization, a leader who does not lead with his/her feelings or fear the demise of their popularity. This book describes what more than 50 years of leading and managing change taught the author - successes and scars to prove it.



The History of Wood Badge in the United States by COL (Ret) Kenneth P. Davis, DCS '93 and the Boy Scouts of America. Wood Badge is a leadership program for adult Scouters worldwide. Soon after founding the Scout

movement, Robert Baden-Powell saw the need for leader training and the first Wood Badge course was held in 1919. The Boy Scouts of America has used the program since 1936. This book traces the start and development of Wood Badge in the U.S.



The Generals' War: Operational Level Command on the Western Front in 1918 by MG (Ret) David T. Ząbecki, DCS '95. World War I introduced new forms of mass destruction and modern technological warfare. When the Bolsheviks pulled

Russia out of the war in late 1917, the Germans turned their offensive efforts to the Western Front in an attempt to win the war in 1918. But as fresh American troops entered Europe, the strategic scales tipped against Germany. Much of how WWI played out turned on the plans and decisions of the senior-most German and Allied commanders and this explores the military strategies of those generals during the last year of the Great War. These six very different men included Germany's Field Marshal Paul von Hindenburg and General Erich Ludendorff; France's Marshals Ferdinand Foch and Philippe Pétain; Great Britain's Field Marshal Sir Douglas Haig; and the U.S.' General John Pershing. Although history remembers none of them as great captains, these six officers determined for better or worse how WWI was fought on the battlefields of the Western Front between November 1917 and November 1918.



The Bavarian Army 1806-1813 translated by Mr. Richard L. Sanders, RES '96. This book, written by Peter Bunde, Markus Gaertner, and Markus Stein, was originally published in German. During the Napoleon era, the Kingdom of Bavaria

among France's German allied states, provided the largest contingent with 30,000 soldiers and due to its size, took part in decisive fighting in the 1809 and 1812 campaigns. This thoroughly researched book presents a comprehensive work about the organization and individual branches in the field. These descriptions are supplemented by accounts of the Bavarians' combat engagements in the campaigns of 1806-07 against Prussia and Russia. Numerous photos of uniform artifacts, graphics by Dr. Peter Bunde on uniforms and equipment of all the branches, plus flags, previously unpublished plates by Patrice Courcelle, as well as many, partly contemporary illustrations complement the informative text.



Cocktails from Hell: Five Complex Wars Shaping the 21st Century by COL (Ret) Austin Bay, DDE '98. Even in the absence of a major war, fuses are lit in practically every region and on every continent, which could eventually ignite a global conflagration and draw the world's superpowers into a deadly and catastrophic conflict. The U.S., Russia, and China all eye these regional conflicts with care, hoping to use this turmoil to advantage, but also attempting to avoid major direct intervention that would trigger their rivals into action. We are, perhaps, at the most dangerous moment since 1914, when similar smoldering conflicts led to the senseless mass slaughter known as WWI. Bay provides a concise and valuable guide to the most dangerous threats against peace facing the U.S. and the world. He uses his critical eye and sharp pen to bring each of these bubbling global situations into sharp focus, both in their local and global contexts.



Thunder in the Argonne: A New History of America's Greatest Battle by Dr. (COL, Ret) Douglas V. Mastriano, RES'10 & former FAC. In July 1918, sensing that the German Army had lost crucial momentum, Supreme Allied Commander

Ferdinand Foch saw an opportunity to end WWI. In drafting his plans for a final grand offensive, he assigned the most difficult sectorthe dense Argonne forest and the vast Meuse River valley-to the American Expeditionary Forces under General John J. Pershing. There, the Doughboys faced thickly defended German lines with terrain deemed impossible to fight through. From September 26 through the November 11 armistice, U.S. forces suffered more than 20,000 casualties a week, but the Allies ultimately prevailed in a decisive victory that helped to end the Great War. This comprehensive account of this legendary campaign not only provides American, French, and British perspectives on the offensive, but offers-for the first time in English-the German view. It presents a balanced analysis of successes and failures at all levels of command, examining the leadership of the principals while also illuminating acts of heroism by individual soldiers.



Medal of Honor: Alvin York, a digital book by AUSA and Dr. (COL, Ret) Douglas V. Mastriano, RES '10 & former FAC. On October 8, 1918, Alvin York was part of a small patrol fighting behind enemy lines during the Meuse-


Argonne campaign of World War I. Suddenly a German machine gun brought down most of his platoon. York assumed command of the seven surviving Americans, took out the machine-gun nest, and captured 132 German soldiers. Corporal York was soon awarded sergeant's stripes—and a Medal of Honor. One

hundred years later, the AUSA Book Program has recognized this remarkable act of valor with the release of this full-color digital graphic novel created by a talented team drawn from the world of professional comic book publishers, showing how a reluctant hero became one of America's most celebrated soldiers. Coulon de Villiers: An Elite Military Family of New France translated by COL (Ret) Samuel L. Russell, RES '12 & FAC. This work is fundamental to historians and scholars documenting the French and Indian War and the officers

Coulon de Villiers comprising a father and his six sons. All were killed, wounded, or died of disease in the service of their King. Yet despite their renown, or perhaps because of it, the accomplishments of these seven men have been overlooked, ignored, misunderstood, or misconstrued by historians spanning more than two and a half centuries. Amédée E. Gosselin, Pierre-Georges Roy, and Aegidius Fauteux exhaustively mined the Canadian archives to distinguish father from sons and brother from brother. Their collective work is essential to understanding this fascinating and historically significant family and Russell presents the first English translation of their compiled works. He diligently corrects and complements with appendices, notes, and an expansive bibliography.



REDEFINING Redefining the Modern Military: THE MODERN The Intersection of Profession MILITARY and Ethics by Lt Col Tyrell O. Mayfield, USAF, RES '18, and Nathan K. Finney. This edited collection examines the changing character of military professionalism and the role

of ethics in the 21st century military. The authors, who range from uniformed military to academics to non-uniformed professionals on the battlefield, delve into whether the concepts of Samuel Huntington, Morris Janowitz, and Sir John Hackett still apply, how training and continuing education play a role in defining a profession, and if a universal code of ethics is required for the military as a profession. This puts a significant emphasis on individual agency for military professionalism as opposed to broad organizational or cultural change.



Igniting the American **Revolution** 1773-1775 Lt Col Derek W. Beck, USAF, RES '19. This draws on meticulous new research and previously unpublished erek w. Beck documents to reveal the full story that ignited the Revolution

-- told from both the British and the American

sides. The Revolutionary War did not begin with the Declaration of Independence, but several years earlier with the Boston Tea Party. Spanning the years 1773-1775, this book sweeps readers to the passionate debates within the halls of Parliament and onwards to that fateful Expedition to Concord and the shot heard round the world. With detail and keen insight, Beck brings revolutionary America to life in all its enthusiastic and fiery patriotic fervor, painting a nuanced portrait of the war's perspectives, ambitions, people, and events. This is a thorough and nuanced telling of these landmark years in our nation's history.



The War Before Independence 1775-1776 by Lt Col Derek W. Beck, USAF, RES '19. The U.S. was creeping ever closer to independence as impassioned revolutionaries took up arms for and against King and country. This captivating blend of

careful research and rich narrative continues exploration into the period preceding the Declaration of Independence, just days into the new Revolutionary War. This transports readers into the violent years of 1775 and 1776, with the infamous Battle of Bunker Hill -- a turning point in the Revolution -- and the snowy, wind-swept march to the frozen ground at the Battle of Quebec, ending with the exciting conclusion of the Boston Campaign. Meticulous research and new material drawn from letters, diaries, and investigative research throws open the doors not only to familiar figures, but also little-known triumphs and tribulations of America's greatest military leaders, including George Washington.



The Road to War: World War I - Western Front (A Travel Guide for Exploring the Battlefields of Europe) by Mr. John R. Dunlavey, DDE 19. A one of a kind, military history travel guide. This is focused on the Belgium and

French battlefields of the "Great War" that shook the world, such as The Somme, Verdun, and Passchendaele. The book covers over 30 critical battles that took place from 1914-1918 in Belgium and France. Each battle has a summary, places to see related to the battle with geo coordinates, a color map, and photography. It is a must have for casual travelers, history buffs, and war nerds!



Challenges of Command in the Civil War: Generalship, Leadership, and Strategy at Gettysburg, Petersburg, and Beyond, Volume I: Generals and Generalship by Dr. Richard J. Sommers, former FAC. This book distills into two volumes six decades of original research and new ways of looking at familiar facts from a lifetime of study of the Civil War. The subsequent volume will explore "Civil War Strategy, Operations, and Organization." Grant and Lee stand out in Volume I as their generalship throughout the Civil War is analyzed, with special attention to the decisive Virginia Campaign from May 1864 to April 1865. Five chapters evaluating Grant and Lee are followed by five more on "Civil War Generals and Generalship." One of those essays, "American Cincinnatus," explores 20 citizensoldiers who commanded mobile army corps in the Union Army and explains why such officers were selected for senior command. Antietam, Gettysburg, and Petersburg are central to three essays on Northern corps and wing commanders. Both Federals and Confederates are featured in "Founding Fathers: Renowned Revolutionary War Relatives of Significant Civil War Soldiers and Statesmen."



Way: A Radical Patton's Theory of War by Dr. James K. Morningstar, FAC. This is a unique approach to the legend of General George S. Patton, Jr., arguing that popular representations are built on misconceptions and incomplete

understandings. The secret to Patton's success was a radical and purposely-crafted doctrine developed over several decades. The author identifies four core principles in Patton's creed and details how Patton developed and applied each one, using the breakout from Normandy as a case study: targeting the enemy's morale through shock; utilizing highly practiced combined arms mechanized columns; relying on mission tactics and flexible command and control; and employing multi-layered and synthesized intelligence systems to identify enemy capabilities and weak spots. These precepts directly contradicted official U.S. Army doctrine and created issues that led commanders to truncate Patton's operations in Tunisia, Sicily, and France. Morningstar discusses the "death and resurrection" of Patton's ideas in the U.S. Army following WWII to the present and comments on the status of Patton's ideas in the Army today.

U.S. ARMY HERITAGE AND EDUCATION CENTER

I take this opportunity to introduce myself as the Interim Director of U.S. Army Heritage and Education Center (USAHEC.) I came on aboard in mid-July to serve as the Deputy and upon the retirement of COL Geoff Mangelsdorf, I have assumed the position of Interim Director until the hiring of a Title X Director. By converting the Director's position to a Title X civilian, USAHEC will acquire the continuity the position deserves. At the appropriate time, I will revert back to the uniformed Deputy Director position and expect to be in the position for the next 15 months. Over the previous two years, I have served at the Peacekeeping and Stability Operations Institute here on Carlisle Barracks, so I am familiar with the day-to-day policies and leadership team of the USAWC. That background will allow me to focus on learning the workings of the USAHEC and I look forward to working with the great USAHEC team.

The number one priority for the USAHEC over the next five years is the effort to digitize the USAHEC Collection. The Army demonstrated its interest and support of this effort by allocating \$23.7 million towards a digitization contract which was awarded on 27 September 2018. The resources applied to this effort demonstrates how much the Army and the USAWC leadership value the importance of the USAHEC Collection being readily accessible to the public. Over the course of the project, there will be times when collections are unavailable, but with this inconvenience comes accessibility to a much larger amount of material to a worldwide audience. The USAHEC looks forward to better serving the Army and the Nation, through materials including artifacts, manuscripts, photographs, and audio-visual items available online. As part of the digitization effort, the USAHEC will also implement a new search interface, integrating all of the USAHEC Collections into one search engine.

The USAHEC continues to be a "showcase" stop for many distinguished visitors hosted by the USAWC. This ensures we are able to message civilian and Army leadership about the many programs the USAHEC executes and supports to connect the public with the Army, while also providing expert academic research and analysis to Army leadership. The USAHEC continues to serve as a popular venue for meetings and events, and the most prominent hosting opportunity came at the end of September when USAHEC was used as the location for an annual meeting of the Mid-Atlantic/Northeast Civilian Aides to the Secretary of the Army. This provided an opportunity to familiarize this influential body with both the mission of the USAWC and the value of USAHEC, as we continue "Telling the Army Story... One Soldier at a Time."

PEACEKEEPING AND STABILITY OPERATIONS INSTITUTE (PKSOI)

Prof. Flavin was the longest tenured member of the PKSOI staff, stepping away from his Assistant Director duties. He was THE FACE of PKSOI for 18 years, having seen its transition from the Peacekeeping Institute (PKI) to its current form. Prof. Flavin was the institutional knowledge and the driving force behind many of our governmental and international connections, as well as a thought leader in peace, stability, and United Nations operations. GEN (Ret) Gordon R. Sullivan, RES '78, who founded PKI while serving as the 32nd Chief of Staff of the Army, and MG John S. Kem, 51st Commandant, were on hand to help bid Prof. Flavin farewell. Bill will be sorely missed, and we wish him well in his retirement.

As part of PKSOI's outreach to advance strategic thinking and understanding of stabilization-related activities, PKSOI and the Association of the U.S. Army (AUSA) co-hosted a one-day seminar at the AUSA conference center on September 17th. The seminar focused on ongoing NATO efforts to define and integrate its "Projecting Stability" concept. NATO Deputy Secretary General Rose Gottemoeller provided the keynote address highlighting how

As part of its education, training, and exercise program efforts, PKSOI hosted its 12th annual Peace and Stability Operations Training and Education Workshop at the USAWC from April 18-20, 2018. The theme of this year's workshop was "The Struggle for Legitimate



Governance," with the goal of facilitating dialogue on collaboration opportunities and expanding networks across shared communities of interest. This year's event featured five separate workgroups entitled: Protection of Civilians; Operationalizing the Women, Peace, and Security Agenda; Humanitarian Assistance in a Complex Environment; Civil Affairs' Role in Stability; and Operationalizing Governance. Within the past several months, PKSOI also participated in the U.S. Institute of Peace's Inter-Organizational Tabletop Exercise on preventing and combatting violent extremism in Mindanao, Philippines, and the Challenges Forum Partnership Workshop in Cairo, Egypt. PKSOI partnered with Penn State University-Harrisburg's Justice Department to compile and publish a book on U.S. Foreign Police Advising: The Case of Vietnam, as well as completing a rewrite of the military chapter of the "Guide for Participants in Peace, Stability, and Relief Operations," which will be published later this year by the U.S. Institute for Peace. PKSOI leadership will also soon travel to USARPAC and meet with senior staff to discuss issues for collaboration leading up to next year's PKSOI-AUSA Stability Seminar focusing on the Indo-Pacific.

SSI DIRECTOR RETIRES

This past July, **Dr. Doug Lovelace** retired from the USAWC's Strategic Studies Institute (SSI) after more than 20 years as a research professor, director of research, and-most importantly-the Institute's first ever civilian director. Doug came to SSI following a long career in uniform including assignments as an attack helicopter battalion commander, on the Joint Staff, and on the USAWC faculty. But being the director of an internationally known research institute

was a different type of challenge. In his quiet way, Doug mastered it, leaving a legacy that will shape strategic thinking for many years.

One of the initial challenges Doug faced was helping SSI adjust to dramatic changes in the information environment driven by the explosion of the Internet. Before he arrived, SSI was an almost monastic place that produced a few dozen studies a year that were distributed mostly to military offices. It had only created its own web page a few years earlier and taken the first tentative steps into building a wider audience. Doug saw this as both a challenge and an opportunity.

His timing was right. In the post 9/11 world where Americans no longer took security for granted and the character of warfare, the very meaning of security underwent dramatic change. Debates on strategy were no longer esoteric but very real. To capitalize on this, Doug led a major improvement of the SSI website, eventually turning it into a depository of knowledge about security and warfare with a global audience. SSI became a go-to source for strategic research. He built a network of external research associates and adjunct research professors, and expanded SSI's academic engagement program. Centered on the annual USAWC Strategy Conference that SSI had organized since the early 1990s, this program also included partnered conferences with universities like Harvard, Stanford, Georgetown, and Princeton. And Doug also took SSI international, developing relationships with like-

minded research institutes around the world. As he did this, Doug knew that SSI's preeminent customer was the Army and the Joint Force so he committed the Institute to research that helped senior uniformed leaders think through complex strategic problems. SSI led studies of conventional military operations in Afghanistan and Iraq, strategic level decision making during the Iraq conflict, the future of American strategy, and Joint strategic landpower. It developed an annual Key Strategic Issues List to help Army War College students research the things that mattered most to senior leaders. By focusing SSI research this way, the Institute helped shape service and Joint doctrine. Many manuals continue to cite SSI studies. And under Doug's direction, SSI researchers played a role in wider thinking on security issues. Rarely did a month go by without interview requests for SSI experts from national print and broadcast media.

Much of this success was due to Doug's "people" skills. To expand knowledge and shape ideas on national security, SSI needed creativity. But leading creative people can be a challenge and sometimes requires a very different skill set than the one that even a successful career officer had. Doug figured this out on the fly and learned to give SSI's researchers rein when needed and guidance when that was called for.

Visitors to SSI are often amazed by how small the organization is. Given its reputation and role in shaping thinking on warfare and security, outsiders assume it is huge. It isn't. Instead, under Doug's leadership, SSI routinely punched above its weight in the battle of ideas. Getting it to that point was a monumental accomplishment and the Army War College, the Army, and the Nation are better for it.

Dr. Neiberg's international media events included one with Poland's Discovery Channel on the 14 Points and another with Australian Broadcasting Company for an academic roundtable on the Treaty of Versailles. The Polish documentary included information on Wilson, Edward House, and the end of WWI. Dr. Neiberg prepared a Belleau Wood podcast for Dan Snow, David Lloyd George's great grandson and one of the most popular British podcasters. He has also led webinars, one to help high school teachers increase knowledge of WWI, and one for 200 students in Indiana at the Culver Academy. Dr. Neiberg is also continuing to publish with a recent chapter in a new French book, *Une Histoire de la Guerre*, which is getting some serious attention in France.

John was truly a Soldier's Soldier. He enlisted in the Army in 1958 upon graduation from high school. After achieving the rank of corporal, he was selected for and survived OCS, and became an 18-year-old Infantry lieutenant. He was released in 1960 to attend Saint Anselm College and then Boston College for a graduate degree in philosophy. In 1966, John rejoined the Army and went to Vietnam as a staff officer and then a company commander in the 2nd Battalion, 1st Infantry, 196 Light Infantry Brigade. After Vietnam, John went to the U.S. Military Academy where he taught philosophy. He returned to the operational force for a short assignment to Fort Bragg and then another tour in Vietnam with MACV. He was assigned to Fort Bragg as operations officer and then executive officer, 1st Battalion (Airborne), 325nd Infantry, 82nd Airborne Division. John continued with the 82nd and had assignments as the Division Personnel Officer and the 2nd Brigade Executive Officer, culminating as Commander, 3rd Battalion, 325th Infantry. (John had a great love of Airborne Soldiers, which resulted in later visits of the 82nd Airborne Division's All American Chorus to USAWC events.) He became Chief, Infantry Branch and Commander, 3rd Brigade, 7th Infantry Division (Light) at Fort Ord, California. He would serve

as Chief of Staff, 25th Infantry Division (Light), and as PACOM Chief, Operational Plans Division before coming to the USAWC faculty (DMSPO) in July 1990. John became the Deputy Commandant in February 1992, serving there until his retirement in September 1995. John and his wife Nancy (who also recently passed away) were key members of the USAWC community, hosting some of the best events in Quarters 2. John was responsible for establishing the tradition of having the 3rd Infantry, the Old Guard, open each class with a performance and parade on Thorpe Field. He continued to serve by becoming the Cumberland County Director of Veterans Affairs in 1996 after Army retirement. This was a special job John enjoyed for six years as he helped Soldiers adjust to the VA system. John left that position to become Chief Clerk of Cumberland County for three years, the head executive management official in the county. He continued his work to help Soldiers throughout this period, forming the Cumberland County Honor Guard to provide honors to veterans during burials in Cumberland County. As John frequently said, he "was most proud of being part of this Honor Guard." It gave special meaning to his life which was devoted to "Duty, Honor and Country."

MG (Ret) Sidney Shachnow, RES '79

MG (Ret) Sid Shachnow, a survivor of the Holocaust, veteran of the Vietnam War, and one of the top Army officers in Berlin during the Cold War, died September 28, 2018 at the age of 83. He retired from the Army in 1994, after 40 years of active-duty service. Born in Kaunas, Lithuania, he witnessed the horrors of WWII from the confines of a forced labor camp, imprisoned when he was only 7 years old. His father escaped German detention and fought out the rest of


