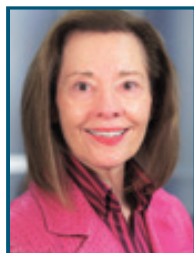

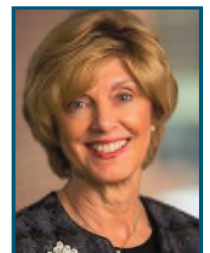

One of our big efforts over the last few months has been the start of the planning and design effort for a new main academic building to be completed by 2022/23. Truly a once-every-50 to 70 year opportunity, we are using this time to reimagine a hub of learning and innovation. If we simply end up with a nicer building than we have now, it would be a failure on our part. So, we have visited several major U.S. universities that have recently built innovative new academic spaces to talk with them and tour their state-of-the-art buildings. In the coming months, we will visit corporate academic hubs and capture their best ideas as well. We are also using this effort as a forcing function, far beyond just the physical building. A reimagined War College includes a major review of our educational methodology to ensure we incorporate the very best ideas used in other educational institutions, both home and abroad and in the public and private sector. More to follow in the future!

I have included a few photos of recent program activities. For the first time in a very long time, we sent two seminar teams overseas to pilot the costs and benefits to our learning outcomes. One group went to Jordan and Israel, and the other group to Chile and Colombia. As you would expect, the students highlighted how much the experiences brought together what they had learned throughout the year. The resident program also just got back from their NYC and Washington, DC trips, which were their usual great successes!

The Army War College remains the leading strategic thought and ideas center for the Army, the Joint Force, and the Nation as a whole. The entire USAWC team continues to look for more opportunities to continue to expand and improve on this effort in the coming year.

Finally, before I sign off, I want to thank CSM Christopher Martinez for his service as the College CSM from June 2015 to April 2018. We are better as a result of his insight and leadership and he and Janet have truly made a difference. Welcome to CSM Alan and Sandra Hummel and they are already making a difference, too!

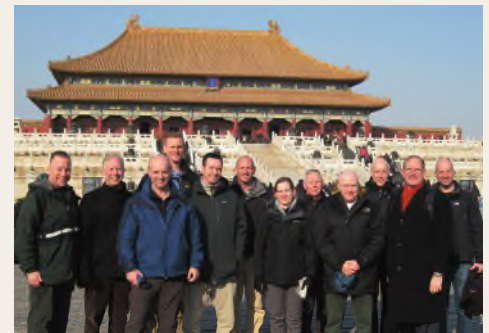

# SCHOOL OF STRATEGIC LANDPOWER (SSL) – DEAN'S MESSAGE

Greetings! We've had excellent progress across both the Distance and Resident Education Programs (DEP and REP) as the Classes of 2018 rapidly approach graduation and the DEP Class of 2019 approaches its First Resident Course.

In July 2018, the Joint Staff will conduct a Process for Accreditation of Joint Education (PAJE) assessment to determine if we will be able to award Joint PME level II credit for our Joint Studies Program (JSP), which is a subset of the distance program. We are very confident that the curriculum meets the joint requirements. A key issue will be the manner in which we've adjusted the seminar mix and some of the educational events to effectively meet the acculturation standards. I hope to provide good news on the outcome in the fall magazine.

Our Masters of Strategic Studies Degree is up for reaccreditation this year. Consequently, we've had several teams of faculty from across USAWC working on the self-assessment and preparing for the accreditation team's visit (currently scheduled for November 2018). We have rigorous academic programs supported by a robust assessment and governance process that should stand us in good stead. We don't anticipate any difficulties with reaccreditation, but, as with any peer visit/assessment, it is another opportunity for us to take a hard look at our programs and ensure that we're comfortable that we're meeting our responsibilities to society as well as possible.

As the Commandant mentioned in his update (p. 3), there is very positive news about the pending construction of a new academic facility to replace Root Hall. In addition to making significant upgrades to our educational infrastructure, we're also using the opportunity to consider how we might want to reevaluate and potentially change how we deliver our programs in conjunction with the possibilities that new facilities might offer.

In our third year of integrated research projects (IRPs), we have students and faculty working to respond to Chief of Staff of the Army requests for research on climate change and security, Multi-Domain Battle in the Pacific, Korea stabilization after war, total mobilization, and expeditionary wartime sustainment. IRPs have proven to be an excellent way to advance knowledge on important Army issues while giving our students a wonderfully relevant way to meet some of their academic requirements.

In other research endeavors, DCLM has several group efforts underway that capitalize on the expertise within the department: **Dr. Kristin Behfar, COL Mike Hosie, COL Si Martinez, RES '15, Dr. Rich Meinhart, Col Rick Sheffe, Col Cristian Vial, IF Chile, RES '12, COL Dale Watson, RES '12, and Dr. George Woods, RES '02**, are working on a qualitative research project to understand how to better prepare officers to work on an international staff. **Dr. Craig Bullis and Dr. George Woods** will study how participation in negotiations training may effect interpersonal skill development with regard to empathy, perspective-taking, humility, and decision-making styles. **COL Si Martinez and COL Maurice Sipos, RES '17**, have begun a study to gain a deeper understanding of how individual differences in leadership attributes, personality, and interpersonal abilities relate to other measures associated with leadership at the strategic level.

**COL Dave DeTata (DNSS), COL Jerad Harper, RES '15 (DDE), Prof Ray Greene (DNSS, Department of State), Prof. Mike Marra, RES '04 (DMSPO)**, and I were part of USAWC's 14-person team, led by the Commandant, that traveled to Beijing, China to engage with the People's Liberation Army (PLA) Academy of Military Science (AMS). The AMS is a 10,000-person top think tank for the PLA in matters of military strategy, science, and operational art. This was USAWC's 4th meeting with the AMS and second in China. The USAWC team consisted of leadership, staff, faculty, and AY18 students. The four AY18 students on the team presented topics to a very critical audience of approximately 80-100 flag and field grade Chinese officers in the PLA, in addition to USAWC's Commandant, Provost, Dean, and faculty. Class of 2018 Resident students on the trip were **Lt Col Kevin Davidson (USAF)**, and U.S. Army students **LTC Jeremy Gray, LTC Ed Lynch, and LTC Anne Wiersgalla**. The title for this year's 4th annual military-to-military education and research exchange was "International Security Environment & China-U.S. Military Relations." SSL presenters and their topics included LTC Gray's "US Regional Security Assessment," LTC Wiersgalla's "The US Military and the Evolving Global Security Dynamics of the 21st Century," LTC Lynch's "Food/Water Scarcity and Climate Change and their Impact on World/Regional Security," Lt Col Davidson's "Sino-US Military De-confliction Opportunities and Confidence Building Measures, Regional and Global," and my "Afghanistan: International and Regional Coordination to Secure Stability for the Future."



Recently, 18 DCLM faculty members visited agencies in Washington, DC to prepare new instructors, "re-green" experienced instructors, and afford an opportunity to build contacts. Along with a presentation by **Prof. Fred Gellert, RES '08 (DCLM)**, regarding the ongoing development of the Army Futures Command, the trip included visits to: Assistant Secretary of the Army for Financial Management, Budget Liaison; Department of the Army G3 - Force Management; Joint Staff J8 Joint Integrated Air and Missile Defense Organization; and the Secretary of the Air Force - Acquisition.

We completed another successful National Security Staff Ride (NSSR) to New York City from April 17-20, 2018. We had the great privilege to meet with a spectacular array of individuals and organizations who helped bring key themes of our curriculum to life. There were 643 USAWC students, faculty, staff, and spouses participating in the staff ride with visits to 53

institutions representing the diplomatic, economic, and informational instruments of power and national security. Students also met with representatives from 66 permanent missions to the United Nations, providing broad exposure to diverse diplomatic views.

We kicked off the NYC staff ride with a panel presentation titled “Maintaining a Competitive Advantage through Innovative Strategies.” The panel’s moderator was Mr. Jon Fortt, Co-Anchor of CNBC’S “Squawk Alley,” who provided a fascinating contextual set-up challenging the panel members and audience to consider the changing economic and social environment. The other three panelists were: Mr. Scott Shay, Chairman of the Board of Signature Bank; Ms. Betsy Ehrenberg, former corporate senior leader turned entrepreneur in the tech and software industry; and Mr. John Bussey, Associate Editor of the *Wall Street Journal*. The panelists discussed how technological advances had disrupted the economic foundations of their industries (finance, journalism, media, and information technology) and how they and others had responded to these challenges. The panel provided an excellent start for the staff ride, which is held to strengthen students’ understanding of national security and strategy through interaction with key organizations and institutions.



## STRATEGY CONFERENCE 2018

The Advanced Strategic Art Program (ASAP) conducted its annual National Security Staff Ride to Washington, DC that included engagement with an array of public and private entities and individuals significant to developing strategic advisors, senior leaders, and national security professionals. The staff ride included engagements with: the International Committee on the Red Cross; a senior leader roundtable “conversation” hosted by GEN (Ret) Carter Ham at AUSA; Department of State Political-Military and Regional Bureaus; BAE Systems America; Office of the Secretary of Defense and Army experts in the Pentagon; USAID Office of Civil Military Cooperation; The Brookings Institution; Congressional Research Service; and the National Security Council.

## CHAIR OF WAR STUDIES

Since his selection as the first Chair of War Studies three years ago, **Dr. Michael S. Neiberg** has been heavily engaged in speaking engagements and research, particularly in one of his keen areas of expertise, WWI, given the Centennial and commemorative calendar. Below is a sampling of Dr. Neiberg's recent and upcoming events.

**December 18:** Participated at the Johns Hopkins Center for Health Security in Baltimore to advise about the 1918-1919 influenza pandemic and its context in preparation for a major grant to study pandemics and how to prevent them in the future. Met with a team of epidemiologists, public health specialists, and lawyers about security threats, use of history, and how various elements of society (Army, NIH, universities, hospitals, foundations) work together.

**January 8:** Participated in a roundtable on the 100th anniversary of the 14 Points hosted by CSIS in Washington, DC, and chaired by Senator (retired) John Warner. Erez Manela (Harvard), Jennifer Keene (Chapman U.), Mark

Moyar (joining USAID) were other keynotes at the Metropolitan Club, where Tasker Bliss and Elihu Root were both members.



**February 25 - March 1:** Addressed the Institute of National Defense, Lisbon, with about 250 people present and on live feed across Portugal universities.

**March 20:** Addressed the Royal Military Academy, Sandhurst and Kings College, London.

**March 29:** Addressed a National Press Club event in Washington, DC to give major media outlets background into WWI as they get ready to work on 100th anniversary events for the U.S. It was attended by reporters from virtually all major outlets. Other key speakers were Kansas State President **Gen. (Ret) Richard B. Myers USAF, RES '81**, and renowned historian Dr. Margaret MacMillan.



**April 8-11:** Visited Bogota, Colombia with the Advanced Regional Studies program. They met three former FARC guerrillas who accepted the amnesty and have been "rehabilitated" back into Colombian society. They discussed persistent and emerging national security issues.

**April 16-21:** Spoke in Trento, Italy at a conference on conflict termination in 1919. Visited Italy's WWI museum in the Dolomites and a military cemetery with memorials to Italians killed in WWI, Austrians killed in the war (Trento was inside the Austro-Hungarian Empire in 1914), and anti-communist Italian volunteers who fought the Soviets on the eastern front in 1941-1943.



After speaking at a WWI forum in New Haven, CT, Dr. Neiberg rode in a restored 1916 ambulance that saw service on the Somme.

# INTERNATIONAL FELLOWS ALUMNI EVENTS

The U.S. Army War College (USAWC) broke ground in 2018 with two new Advanced Regional Studies elective courses that focused on expanding students' knowledge and understanding of the external strategic environment. With their core Regional Studies class under their belts as a foundation, U.S. students applied for selection to undertake a more intensive study of two countries from the same region. This was the first time these two new courses included travel to the countries they were studying. This year's Middle East course examined Jordan and Israel prior to visiting both countries, while the Americas course studied and traveled to Colombia and Chile. Alumni dinners or receptions in all four countries allowed current students the opportunity to engage with strategic leaders with whom they shared the Carlisle experience – and with whom they could easily interact without the need for translators. 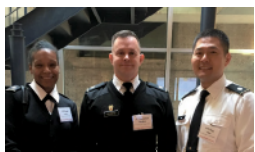

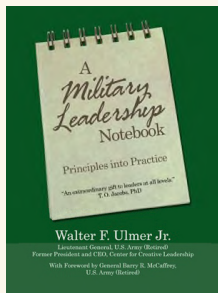


# BOOKS BY GRADS AND FACULTY



**Ranger: A Soldier's Life** by COL (Ret) Ralph J. Puckett, Jr., RES '67. In this autobiography, Puckett recounts his extraordinary experiences on and off the battlefield. During one of the toughest battles of the Korean War, his Ranger Company seized and held Hill 205 overlooking the Chongchon River. Separated by more than a mile from the nearest friendly unit, 51 soldiers fought several hundred Chinese attackers. Puckett was wounded three

times before he was evacuated and for his actions, he received the Distinguished Service Cross. After Korea, Puckett joined the newly established US Army Ranger Department, serving as an instructor and tactical officer, and commanded companies at Fort Benning and in the Ranger Mountain Camp in north Georgia. He went on to lead companies in Vietnam, train cadets at West Point, and organize the Escuela de Lancero leadership course in Colombia. He served as the Honorary Colonel of the 75th Ranger Regiment, honorary instructor at the Infantry School, and was an inaugural inductee into the US Army Ranger Hall of Fame in 1992.



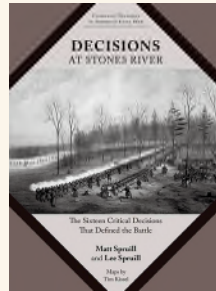
**A Military Leadership Notebook: Principles into Practice** by LTG (Ret) Walter F. Ulmer, Jr., RES '69. Within formal organizations like the military, individuals in charge rely on two sources of authority to get the job done: granted statutory power and personal power, which is gained by earning trust. Good leaders use both. In this book, Ulmer explores what makes a great commander. While he focuses on the military, the leadership lessons he shares work in war

and peace, on land and at sea, and in small and large organizations. He defines leadership, shares his personal philosophy of leadership, reveals tips on measuring a leader's success, and outlines behaviors that can lead to success, as well as those that can lead to disaster. He also wades into the debate over whether leaders are born or made, explains why it's important to respect the authority and responsibility of subordinate leaders, and how to manage organizations and large staffs. No matter what your rank and military or civilian, this guide is a timeless leadership teaching tool.



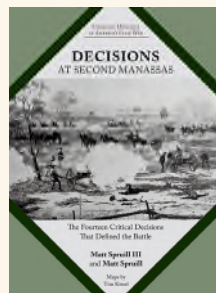
**Tiger Bravo's War** by COL (Ret) Rick St John, RES '86, is the account of a company of young paratroopers (B Company, 2nd Battalion (Airborne), 506th Infantry) during their first year of combat in the Vietnam War. Thirty of its soldiers would be killed in action, and collectively it would amass 150 Purple Hearts. It is also a soldier's tale of the young men of Tiger Bravo -- a story the author knows only too well, as he was one

of those "young paratroopers" whose lives were forever changed by a year of fighting in the jungles of Vietnam. The narrative is based on seven years of research, including battlefield journals/reports, *Stars & Stripes (Pacific)* and the 101st Airborne Division newspaper, *Screaming Eagle*, and interviews, letters and personal correspondence from 50 Tiger Bravo veterans and family members. It contains 11 detailed battle maps and 30 photographs of the characters introduced within its pages.



**Decisions at Stones River: The Sixteen Critical Decisions that Framed the Battle** by COL (Ret) Matt Spruill III, RES '86, and LTC (Ret) Lee Spruill. From December 31, 1862, to January 2, 1863, the Army of the Cumberland and Army of Tennessee fought a bloody battle along Stones River. Led by MG William S. Rosecrans, Union forces would eventually emerge victorious, and coming at the end of a series of Union defeats, this victory

would give Lincoln and the Northern population a bright ray of hope during a fall and winter of reversals. Rather than offering a history of the battle itself, the Spruills focus on the critical decisions that had a major impact on both sides in shaping the progression of the battle. This account is designed to provide a coherent and manageable blueprint of the battle's development, allowing the reader to progress from an understanding of "what happened" to "why events happened." Complete with maps and a guided tour, readers can learn more about Stones River with key insights and a deeper understanding of the Civil War itself.



**Decisions at Second Manassas: The Fourteen Critical Decisions That Defined the Battle** by COL (Ret) Matt Spruill III, RES '86, and LTC (Ret) Matt Spruill IV. Many consider the Battle of Chancellorsville to be Confederate General Robert E. Lee's greatest offensive operation. However, the Battle of Second Manassas may be even more significant. Lee's victory at Chancellorsville resulted in the status quo. His success at Second Manassas

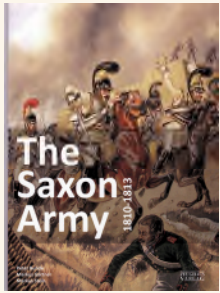
moved the center of the war in the east from Richmond to just outside Washington, DC, and set the stage for Lee's first incursion onto Northern soil. This book looks at the critical decisions made by Confederate and Union commanders and examines them as they shaped the way the campaign and battle unfolded. Also complete with maps and a guided tour, this account is primarily designed to present the reader with a coherent and manageable blueprint of the battle's development and its critical decisions to enable an understanding of not just "what happened" but to "why events happened" as they did. This book advances a deeper understanding of the Civil War itself.



**To Play on Grass Fields** by LTC (Ret) Charlotte "Charlie" Kimball Hudson, DCS '95. Hudson brings a cast of characters to life in this novel about the determination of a man to transform his country and whether or not that may come at too steep a price. Professor Ryan Byrne once believed he could help lift countries into prosperity. When given the opportunity to work with his theories, murder was not the result he anticipated. Barely escaping with

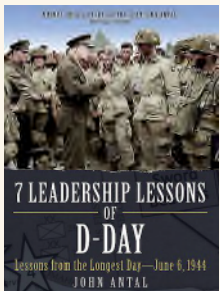
his own life, he plunged into guilt-ridden reflection until he was drawn from self-isolation into other work. King Phillip of Malathos, however, feels Ryan is the man who can help guide his country from centuries of bloody violence and crushing poverty. If he can convert the sham constitutional monarchy into a true state, it is a legacy he will leave for future generations. The King knows there are obstacles to his sweeping vision but what neither man realizes is the depth of betrayal being plotted within the royal house.





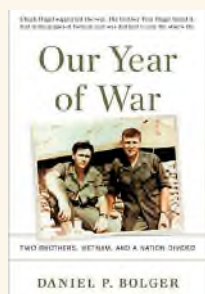
***The Saxon Army 1810-1813* translated by Mr. Richard L. Sanders, RES '96.** This book written by Markus Gärtner, Peter Bunde, and Markus Stein describes how no army of the German Confederation of the Rhine underwent such fundamental changes in organization and uniforms as did the Saxon forces of the Napoleonic era. Based on the experiences from the 1806-07 campaigns on Prussia's side and 1809 allied with the

French, the Saxon Army undertook extensive reforms. This book presents this "new" Saxon Army with numerous contemporary illustrations, with plates by Patrice Courcelle and Edmund Wagner as well as graphic tables of uniforms of all the regiments by Peter Bunde. A description of the war experiences rounds out the presentation and thus the volume gives the reader a good, thorough introduction to the organization, uniforms, and history of the Saxon Army of 1810-1813.



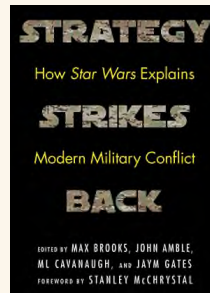
***7 Leadership Lessons of D-Day: Lessons from the Longest Day—June 6, 1944* by COL (Ret) John Antal, RES '98.** The odds were against the Allies on June 6, 1944. The task ahead of the paratroopers who jumped over Normandy and the soldiers who waded ashore onto the beaches, all under fire, was colossal. In such circumstances, good leadership can be the defining factor in victory or defeat. This book is about the extraordinary leadership of seven

men who led American soldiers on D-Day and the days that followed. It is not a full history of D-Day, nor does it cover the heroic leadership shown by men in the armies of the Allies or members of the French Resistance who also participated in the Normandy assault and battles for the lodgment areas. It is a primer on how you can lead today, no matter what your occupation or role in life, by learning from the leadership of these seven in their dramatic and immersive stories that the reader will never forget.



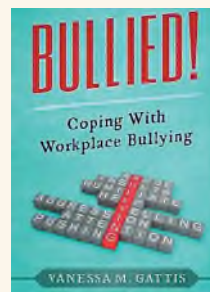
***Our Year of War: Two Brothers, Vietnam, and a Nation Divided* by LTG (Ret) Daniel P. Bolger, RES '98.** Two brothers from Nebraska – Chuck and Tom Hagel – went to war in 1968 in Vietnam. America was divided. Flag-draped caskets came home by the thousands. Riots ravaged our cities. Assassins shot our political leaders. Black fought white, young fought old, fathers fought sons. Chuck and Tom served side-by-side in the same rifle platoon, fought

in the Mekong Delta, battled snipers in Saigon, chased the enemy through the jungle, and each saved the other's life under fire. But when their one-year tour was over, they came home side-by-side but no longer in step--one supporting the war, the other hating it. Former Secretary of Defense Chuck Hagel and his brother Tom epitomized the best, and withstood the worst, of the most tumultuous, shocking, and consequential year in the last half-century. Following the brothers' paths from the prairie heartland through a war on the far side of the world and back, this tells the story of two brothers, a family, and a nation divided yet still united.



***Strategy Strikes Back: How Star Wars Explains Modern Military Conflict* by MAJ Matthew L. Cavanaugh, BSAP '09** (one of four editors). Over 30 strategists, including generals, policy advisors, seasoned diplomats, counterinsurgency experts, science fiction writers, war journalists, and groundlevel military officers, explain the strategy and the art of war by way of the *Star Wars* films. Each chapter provides a relatable, outside-the-box

way to clarify the complexities of modern military conflict. A chapter on the case for planet building on the forest moon of Endor by *World War Z* author Max Brooks offers a unique way to understand our own sustained engagement in war-ravaged societies. Another chapter on counterinsurgency against the Rebellion sheds light on the logic behind past military incursions. Whether using the destruction of Alderaan as a means to explore the political implications of targeting civilians, examining the pivotal decisions made by Yoda and the Jedi Council to differentiate strategic leadership in theory and in practice, or considering the ruthlessness of Imperial leaders to explain the toxicity of top-down leadership, this gives fans of *Star Wars* and aspiring military minds alike an inspiring and entertaining means of understanding many facets of modern warfare.



***Bullied! Coping with Workplace Bullying* by COL Vanessa M. Gattis, PhD, RES '11.**

Workplace bullying, the repeated and regular act of harassing, offending, socially excluding someone, or negatively affecting someone's work over time, has been recognized as a serious threat to the health and well-being of employees. This study sought to explore resilience as a coping strategy to help improve the physical and mental health effects of

professional women who have or are experiencing workplace bullying. Using a qualitative methodology with a single-case study design, 10 professional women who have and are still experiencing workplace bullying were commissioned to participate. To increase the validity of the results, four data techniques were employed: open-ended interviews, researcher notes with observations, and two surveys. Four major themes emerged: Negative Experiences, Consequences of Bullying, Impact on Health, and Support Systems. The participants reported that various support systems and networks greatly increased their resilience at work.

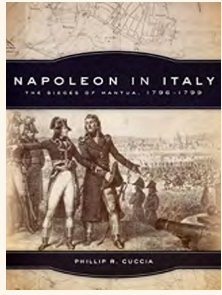


***The Wicked Problem of Cultural Heritage and Conflict: Military Involvement in the Protection and Devastation of Cultural Property* by COL (Ret) Christopher Herndon, DDE '11, and Joris D. Kila.** The world's cultural heritage is not only threatened by time, nature, and human development, but also increasingly by armed conflicts. We see destructions caused by looting and illicit traffic but also iconoclasm and manipulations of cultural heritage for political,

religious, economic, and propaganda reasons. Revenues derived from the illegal selling are often used to finance conflicts as illustrated in the Da'esh business model example in this publication. Cultural Property Protection measures, while legally mandatory under national and international law, are poorly implemented and sanctions are

rarely enforced. There is however, a constant and international demand for education and multidisciplinary research on the topic, especially in the context of conflict and crime, so research must include military perspectives. A selection of field case examples and recent developments feed research and dialogue about the use and abuse of cultural heritage, with a focus on cooperation between civil stakeholders and military parties.

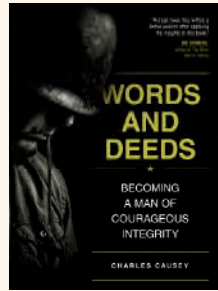


***Napoleon in Italy: The Sieges of Mantua, 1796-1799*** by COL Phillip R. Cuccia, USAWCF '13.

In the center of Mantua, in northern Italy, a covered bridge stretches over the narrow Rio where

vendors sell fish from pushcarts just as locals did more than 200 years ago when Napoleon Bonaparte laid siege to the city. Four cannon balls protruding out of an adjacent wall offer a tacit monument to the sufferings of townspeople during the siege, when the city, held by Austrian troops, finally fell under French control. Two years later, Mantua was again barraged, this time by a combined Austrian and Russian army, which took it back after four months. Cuccia brings to light two understudied aspects of these trying periods in Mantua's history: siege warfare and the conditions it created inside the city.

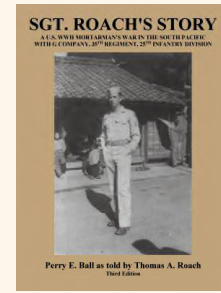
Drawing on underutilized military records in Austrian, French, and Italian archives, he delves into these important conflicts to integrate political and social issues with a campaign study. By placing the sieges of Mantua in an 18<sup>th</sup> century international context, Cuccia gives readers a broader understanding of siege warfare and of how the global impacts the local.



***Words and Deeds: Becoming a Man of Courageous Integrity*** by CH (LTC) Charles M. Causey, DDE '14.

We know intuitively that the best life is a life where our words and our deeds count for something greater than ourselves. Our hearts quicken when we hear a rousing call to action, when we see someone taking a hill that must be taken. We know that doing and saying nothing is beneath us—that our words and deeds can be the best things about us. This book is an integrity-pulse check packed with inspiring war stories. It offers a way of gauging the strength of our integrity and a path toward growing in courage. There is a unique diagnostic assessment for men to take and see how they are utilizing both words and deeds as instruments of their character. As you learn to align your words and deeds, you will be inspired and empowered to get off

the couch and live a life of significance. In addition to the diagnostic assessment tool, it offers a 6-week small group Bible study guide.



***Sgt. Roach's Story: U.S. WWII Mortarman's War in the South Pacific*** by Perry E. Ball, former FAC. This is the account of G Company, 35th Regiment, 25th Infantry Division, and its participation in

the Luzon Campaign and the liberation of the Philippines in 1945. The story is told through the eyes of Sgt. Thomas A. "Andy" Roach, a Mortarman from G Company's Weapons Platoon, and the recollections of dozens of his fellow soldiers. It covers the period from when Roach joined the unit in New Zealand in December 1943 to when he left the unit in Japan in January 1946. He is the last surviving member of G Company. Roach was born in Holly Springs, Georgia, and is a retired lawyer and a former Georgia State Legislator, having served as both a state senator from 1959 to 1961 and as a state representative from 1966 to 1974. He is still living in his home as of December 2017, surrounded by his family. It has been almost 72 years since Andy came home from the war and this is his story. An envelope of battle maps is included.

My father clearly enjoyed the opportunity to reunite with his classmates as honored guests of the War College, and it was a fitting final visit to his alma mater.

At my mother's request, I wore my father's Army War College ring during his funeral service, where he was buried with full military honors.

I appreciate the Alumni Foundation for allowing me this opportunity to pay a small tribute to my father, addressing the distinguished community of which he was so proud to be a member.

## IRA REQUIRED MINIMUM DISTRIBUTION

Federal tax law calls for Required Minimum Distributions (RMD) from traditional Individual Retirement Accounts, SEP IRAs, and SIMPLE IRAs beginning with the year in which you turn **70 1/2**. These distributions will be included in your taxable income, except for withdrawals that are a return of your basis. If you are facing an RMD from your retirement account, please consider a **direct transfer** of your RMD to the Army War College Foundation. A direct transfer to the Foundation is a tax-free transaction. Tax law extends RMDs to *inherited* retirement accounts, and gives multiple options to beneficiaries. If you have questions about calculating your RMD, or if your situation calls for taking an RMD from the account, consult your tax adviser.

based on Dr. Gary Chapman's book "5 Love Languages" provided a fun event for students and their spouses.

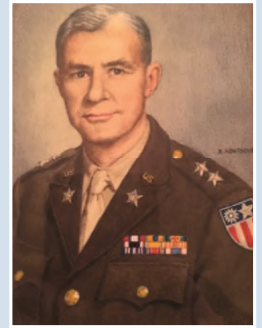

On March 7th, PKSOI conducted a Transition of Authority ceremony from **COL Gregory P. Dewitt, USAWCF '10**, who is preparing for retirement, to **COL Michael W. Rauhut, CSA Sr. Fellow '15**. We wish Greg well in his new post-military career, and thank him for his leadership and dedication to PKSOI over the past two years. Also, **COL James Lowe** transitioned from



the Proponency Division Chief to the Deputy Director position, while **COL Brian Hirschey, RES '16**, stepped up from the Joint Concepts Analyst to Division Chief.

As part of PKSOI's line of effort (LoE) to review concepts and doctrine, **COL Stephen Marr, RES '17**, authored a White Paper on Stability in Multi-Domain Battle (MDB). The paper focused on integrating stability activities within MDB to increase the decision space and expand freedom of operation for the Joint Force. For MDB to succeed, the Army must be able to positively affect the five stability sectors, both directly and through integration with the Joint Force and inter-organizational partners, while also developing effective strategies to preempt or counter adversary destabilization efforts.

Under the LoE of developing education, training, and exercises programs, PKSOI is developing two manuals to educate the force on peace and stability activities. The first publication was the rewrite of the Protection of Civilians (PoC) Military Reference Guide, which was spearheaded by **COL (Ret) Dwight Raymond, RES '02**. PKSOI held a book launch on January 31, 2018 at the U.S. Holocaust Memorial Museum, and included a panel discussion on future trends that might require inclusion in the future. The panel consisted of Dr. Sarah Sewall, Johns Hopkins SAIS; Alison Giffen, Center for Civilians in Conflict; and **MG John Kem, USAWC Commandant**.



The second manual is a military guide on integrating gender perspective in military operations to support the Army in applying the U.S. National Action Plan on Women, Peace and Security (WPS) at the operational level. PKSOI is authoring this guide as the Army lead for WPS to educate the force on the scope and depth of doctrinal

considerations that lead to consolidating gains and resulting in sustainable and resilient societies.

In support of the exercise portion of PKSOI's LoEs, PKSOI supported the Viking 18 peacekeeping exercise from April 16-26, 2018. Viking 18, a U.S. and Swedish-led endeavor, is a large-scale peacekeeping exercise intended to incorporate East European partners under NATO's Partnership for Peace. Thirty-five countries, the UN, EU, and NATO, participated from five remote military sites around the globe. PKSOI provided a control team to support the Brazilian land forces participating in the exercise in anticipation of their eventual deployment to a UN Mission in Africa.

In the interest of supporting the LoE of Informing Policy Development, PKSOI is leading a seminar on "Projecting Stability: Securing NATO's Flanks by Helping its Neighbors Achieve Stability," on September 17, 2018 at the AUSA conference facility. The seminar will consist of three panel discussions focusing on the following themes:

**Panel 1. Projecting Stability in the Middle East and North Africa (MENA) Regions** looking to answer the questions: What does Projecting Stability mean to MENA nations? How do US and NATO efforts nest with Projecting Stability in MENA nations?

**Panel 2. Projecting Stability in Eastern Europe** looking to answer the questions: What is the balance between the US demand for increased European spending for the "big war" vice spending for stability operations? How is NATO working to strike that balance?
